Importance of Veterinary Legislation () 1



Good governance is a recognised global public good of critical importance to **OIE Member Countries** and

legislation is a key element in achieving good governance!

Importance of Veterinary Legislation



- Veterinary legislation provides the powers and authorities necessary for Veterinary Services to efficiently carry out their key functions to ensure public safety and promote the public good.
- In the face of growing global demand for foods of animal origin, increasing world trade, shifting patterns of disease associated with climate change and the emergence and re-emergence of diseases that can rapidly spread across international borders, the Veterinary Services must be supported by effective and modern legislation.


Weaknesses in legislation identified during PVS missions



- Legal texts had been prepared in isolation and without consulting stakeholders;
 - the work of legal experts was often found to have been disconnected from the technical design, with no effective collaboration between veterinarians and legal advisors;
 - absence of an overall strategic vision, with the various domains, including the veterinary domain, seen as the property of a particular administrative entity rather than as national provisions;
 - incomplete coverage of the veterinary domain by existing texts; and
 - defects in the quality of existing texts.

Position of the Veterinary Legislation Support Programme in the PVS Pathway





The purpose of the VLSP is to help governments that wish to modernise their national veterinary legislation and thereby help the Veterinary Services to meet the OIE standards

Objectives of the VLSP Agreement




 To establish specific objectives of legislative reform/modernization

- Training for new VLSP experts including lawyers and veterinarians, March 2015
- Complete requested VLSP identification missions
- Respond to growing requests for Agreements
- Seminars in collaboration with AU-IBAR through VET-GOV on regional harmonisation of veterinary legislation
 - Organized around selected RECs
 - ECCAS and IGAD seminars held in 2014 on animal disease control legislation
 - UMA and SADC scheduled for 2015
 - ECOWAS and EAC proposed for 2016
 - COMESA proposed in 2017
