- > Objectivity

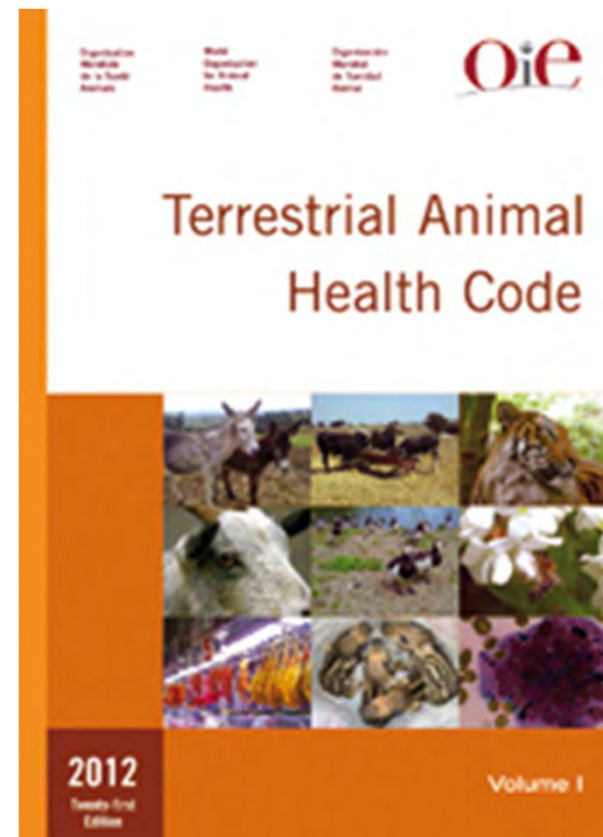
Organizational/technical Nature

added in the 17th edition (2008)



Quality of Veterinary Services

- > **Applicable to Veterinary Services in all regions**
 - Veterinary Services should conform to these principles, regardless of political, economic or social situation

- > **OIE definition of Veterinary Services comprises public and private sector veterinarians and vet para-professionals**

- > **Conformance important to credibility**
 - > For health status claim
 - > For international health certification



Quality of Veterinary Services

Current situation worldwide: wide variety of shortcomings in countries with respect to OIE standards on quality.

- Insufficient / outdated veterinary legislation
- Lack of human, physical and financial resources
- Insufficient national chain of command
- Weakness of private sector organizations
- Few compensation mechanisms
- Limited ability to control livestock movements
- Constraints to implement biosecurity measures
- Difficulty of implementing appropriate vaccination
- Failures in the control of veterinary drugs

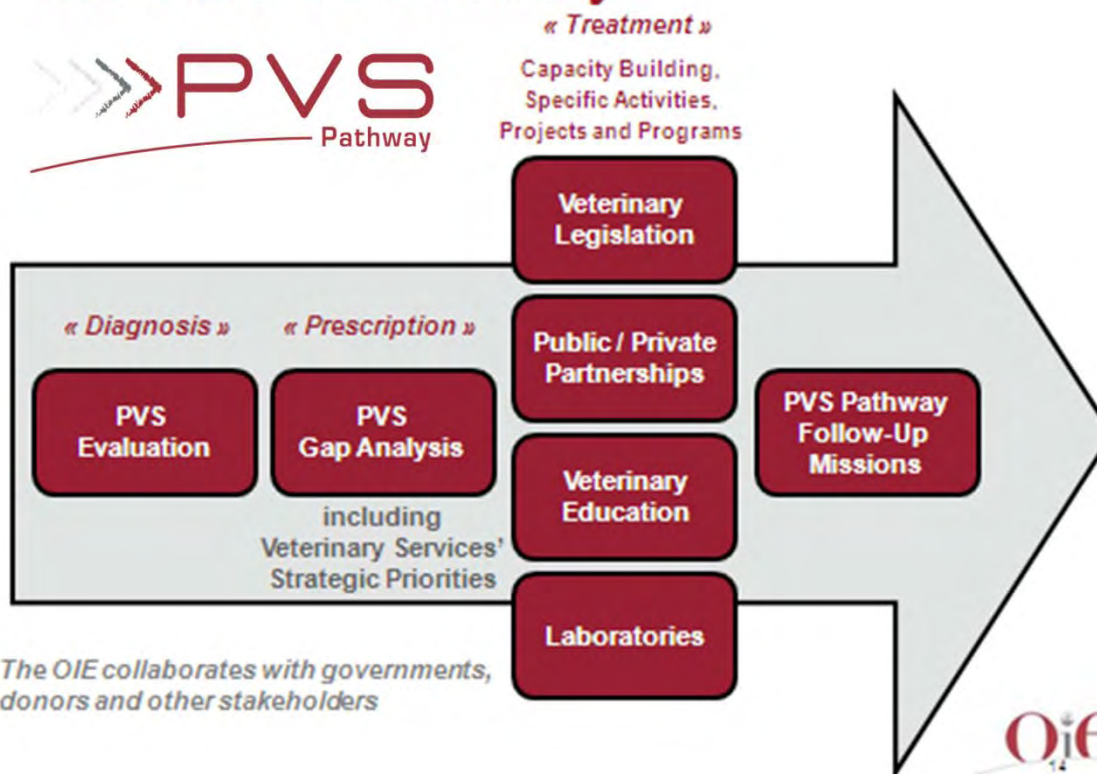

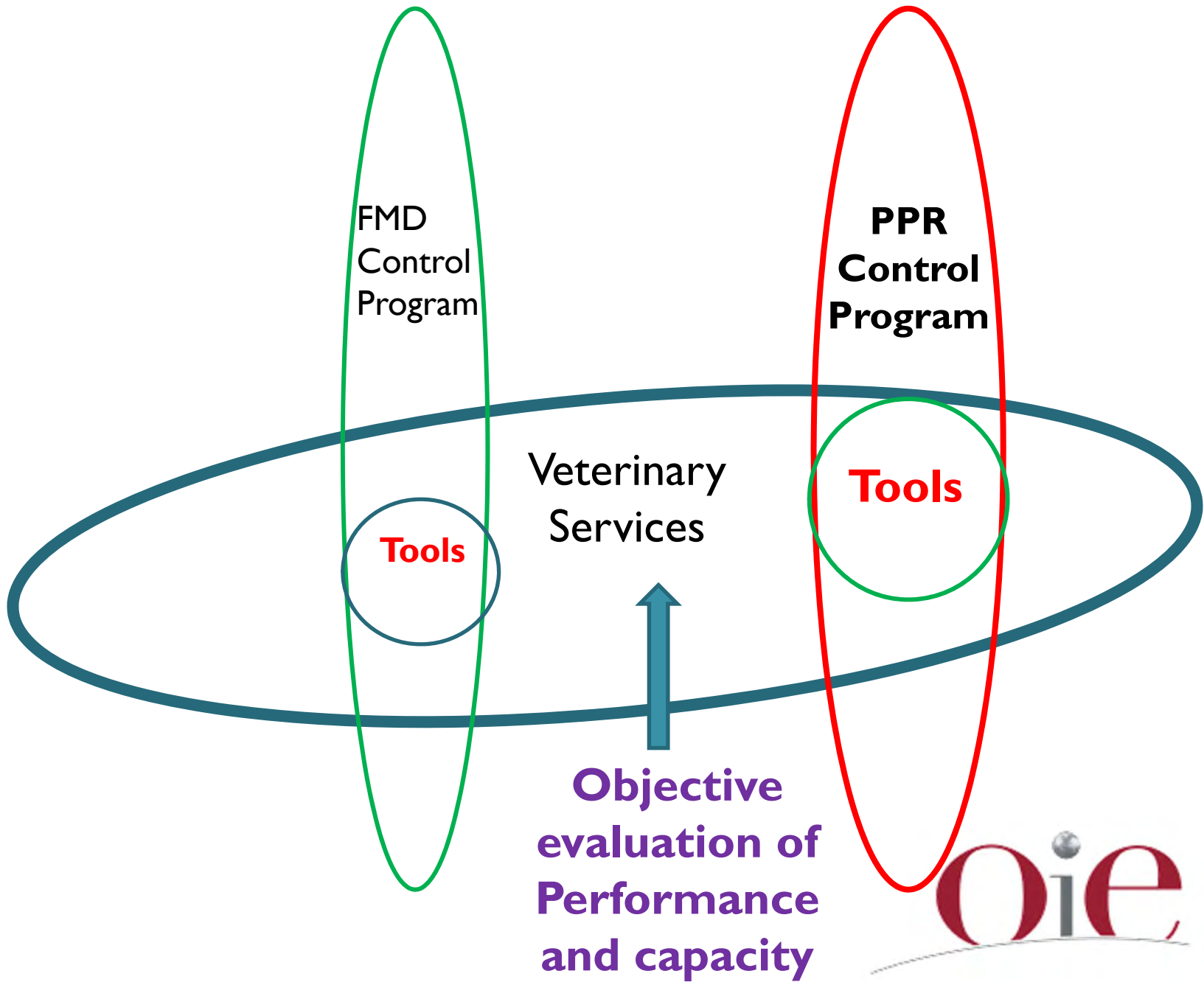
The tool provides you with the objective analysis of

- Service delivery capability





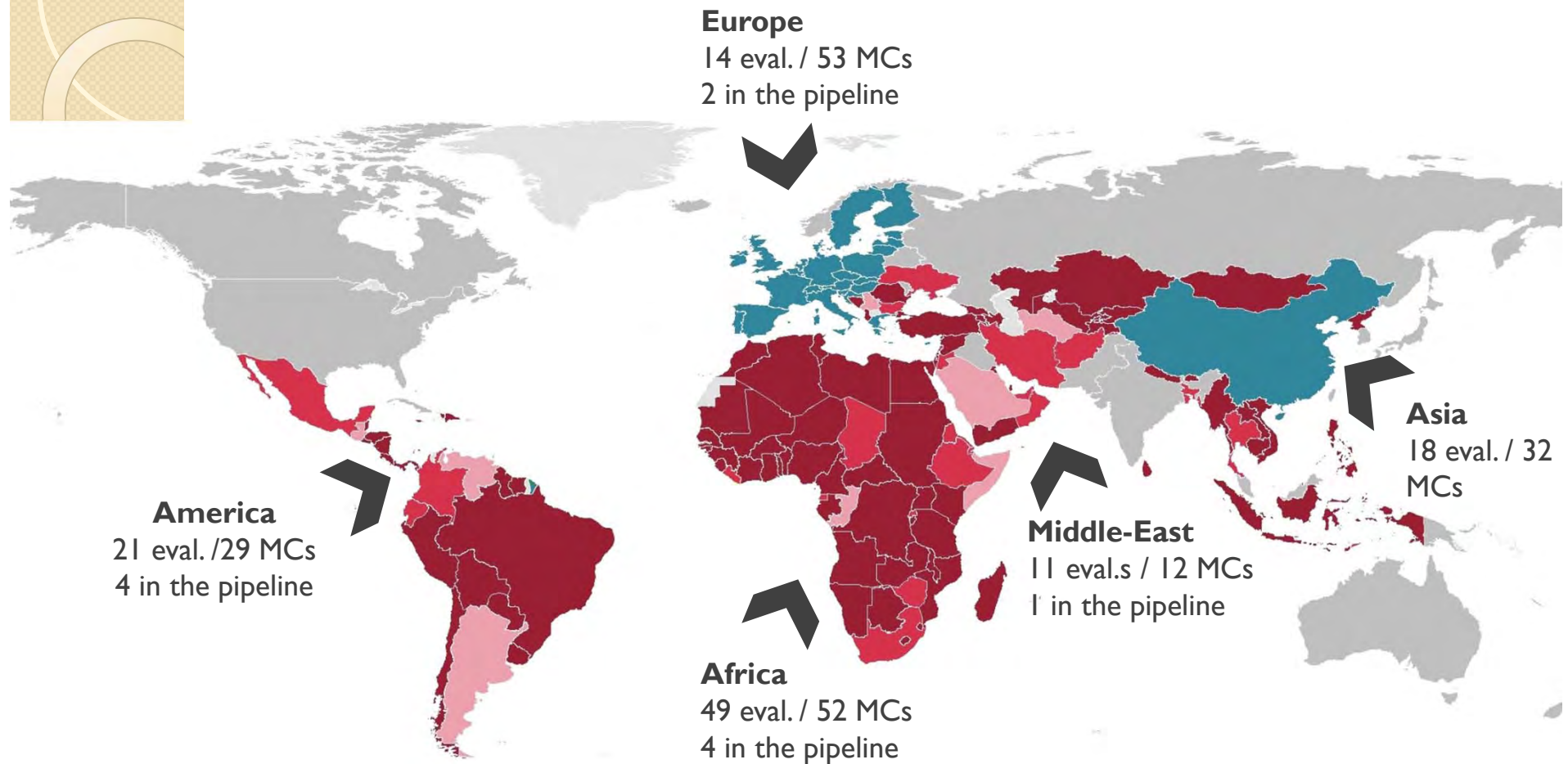

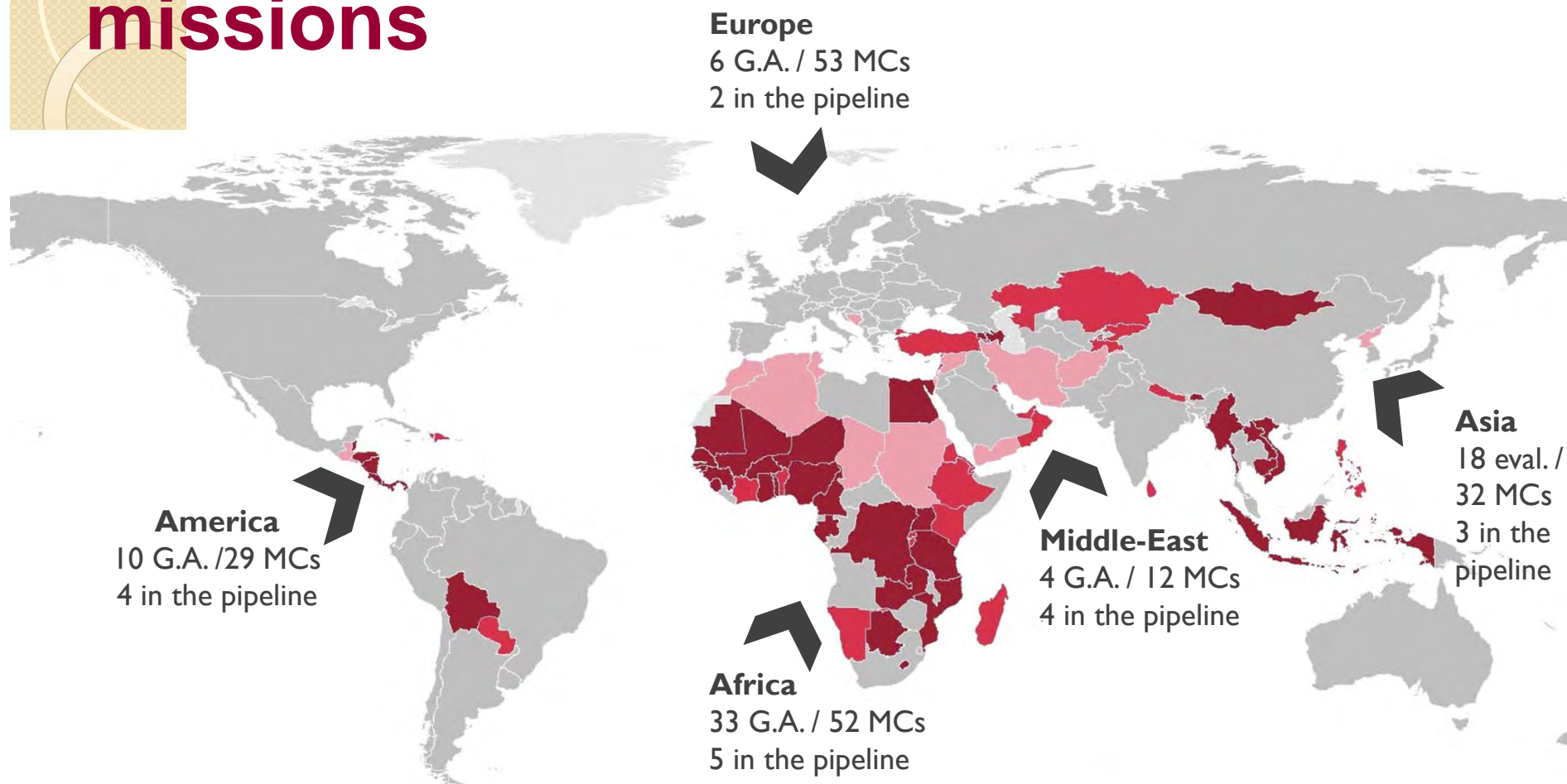
