# The Public-Private Progress project

- A 3 year-project started in November 2016
- Funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation
- Aims to stimulate development of **Public-Private Partnerships** (PPPs) to sustainably improve **Veterinary Services** (VS)
- In this project, a PPP is defined broadly as a **mutually beneficial and sustainable collaboration between the public sector and private interests**: private practitioners, veterinary para-professionals, NGOs, companies, trade associations, etc.
- Step 1= **Diagnostic phase**
  - Identify **PPPs SUCCESS STORIES**
  - Analyse a few successful examples and their economic benefits
  - Take stock of limitations and obstacles
