SCENARIO: LIVE GOATS

YOU ARE EXPORTING 'COUNTRY C'

You have received a request from an association of goat breeders in your country that would like to export goats for reproduction to 'Country Z'.

Task:

- 1. Using the relevant chapters of the *Terrestrial Code*, develop the export health measures, based on the country disease statuses described below.
- 2. What additional information would you prepare and provide at the request of the Veterinary Authority of the importing country to support your disease status claims prior to commencing trade?
- 3. Once ready approach 'Country Z' Group and start the process of negotiation.

Your disease status ('Country C'):

- OIE official recognition as country free from food and mouth disease (FMD) without vaccination:
- Rift Valley fever virus has been reported through WAHIS;
- Self-declared zone free from bluetongue virus;
- Self-declared free from scrapie
- Self-declared free from sheep pox and goat pox
- OIE official recognition as country free from Peste des Petits Ruminants (PPR);
- caprine arthritis/encephalitis virus is present and has been reported through WAHIS; and
- contagious caprine pleuropneumonia is present and has been reported through WAHIS.

'Country Z' (Importing country) claims the following:

- OIE official recognition as country free from **FMD** without vaccination;
- self-declared free from Rift Valley fever virus;
- self-declared free from bluetongue virus;
- self-declared free from scrapie;
- self-declared free from sheep pox and goat pox;
- OIE official recognition as country free from PPR;
- self-declared free from caprine arthritis/encephalitis virus; and
- **contagious caprine pleuropneumonia** is present and has been reported through WAHIS and an official control programme is in place.

<u>NOTE</u>: For the purposes of this exercise no other diseases need to be considered.
