The OIE collaborates with governments, donors and other stakeholders



Principles

- The OIE PVS Pathway is a continuous process to sustainably improve national Veterinary Services
- > External independent process
 - Experts trained and certified by the OIE
 - > Based on facts & evidence, not impressions
- Official request from OIE National Delegate => missions are voluntary
- > Purpose:
 - Assess compliance with OIE standards
 - Identify strengths / weaknesses and areas for improvements
- Report = country property (confidentiality of results, unless agreed)
- Supportive not directive, strong platform for planning & advocacy
- > Strong evidence of **real impacts** in budgets, staffing, infrastructure, governance arrangements, technical capacity etc in many countries



- Develop categories and assessment criteria for the 'Veterinary Domain'






PVS Pathway Basics 1.2 Stages and State of Play

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


PVS Evaluation

- Fully tested, stable and robust process
- Uses the OIE PVS Tool to evaluate and plan against OIE standards
- 2-3 week mission for 2-4 team members, central and field visits,
- For <u>eligible</u> countries, OIE funds experts, country funds domestic travel and support
- Peer reviewed & country approved report
- Aquatic version now established
- PVS Evaluation (esp Tool) is the focus of this training workshop



OIE PVS Pathway



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PVS Gap Analysis

- Led by the country, facilitated by OIE
- > To confirm country's national livestock and VS priorities
- Sets Critical Competency targets
- To determine activities to be carried out to achieve the expected results
- Develop an indicative costing of the human and physical resources required for implementation of activities defined
- To support the preparation of national investment programmes (5 year timeframe)






OIE PVS Pathway – Global State of Play (15 May 2018)



 a properly broad-based systems approach, covering all threats, including emerging






MYTH 1 PVS REPORTS SIT ON A SHELF






OIE's Member Countries' Experience with the PVS Pathway – Questionnaire (Feb-July 2015)






Overall experience of the Member Countries with the PVS Pathway

MYTH 2 PVS PATHWAY IS ONLY FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES - IT IS TOO SIMPLE FOR ADVANCED VS





The PVS Pathway in more highly developed contexts

- History of successful PVS Pathway missions in OECD nations and major exporting nations
- Recent interest from major high-income Member Countries in fully independent OIE PVS Evaluation (Australia- 2015, Japan- 2016 and Canada- 2017)
- Successful missions can verify strength, combat complacency, target investment
- Good reference for other countries
- Simplicity a strength Tool is scaleable



MYTH 3 PVS WON'T TELL US ANYTHING WE DON'T ALREADY KNOW





"We already know our problems and what we have to work on" – REALLY??

- In any system or organisation tendency to continue to do the things that have always been done in the same 'proven' way
- Two major risks:
 - Failure to evolve in a changing context
 - Other areas become neglected/under-resourced
- PVS Pathway external 'circuit breaker' for fresh insights, benchmarked internationally (OIE standards and experts' experience)
- Find out problems BEFORE they bite!



MYTH 4 PVS PRESENTS SIGNIFICANT POLITICAL/TRADE RISKS AND DUPLICATE OTHER AUDITS





PVS Pathway versus trade audit

- PVS Pathway's purpose > national planning/support
- Trade audits' purpose > international or bilateral trade decision making = DIFFERENT CULTURE
- Country in control of PVS Pathway engagement/use (voluntary, confidentiality, respond or not)
- PVS Pathway evaluates the whole system, so broader, trade audits increasingly use PVS methods to bring a systems focus
- PVS Pathway provides a better measure of progress over time (Follow-up) and provides more direct support to planning (Gap Analysis)
- Provides alternative & complementary value, co-exist all over world, risks have not been borne out



2.2 New Opportunities Through PVS Evolution



OIE PVS Think Tank – 4-6 April 2017

- 10 year anniversary
- Biggest risk = complacency
- Think tank- to "evolve" the PVS Pathway
- Highly engaging and successful 3 days
- Main Findings:
- 1. Members deepen & tailor engagement
- 2. Partners raise profile, align to global agendas, make the case = business case
- 3. Staff broaden OIE ownership & use
- 4. Experts refine methods, training strategy

Key theme for Member Countries:

"To enhance country PVS Pathway understanding, ownership and engagement, and provide options to tailor engagement based on governance and/or technical needs"


