#### That OIE standard setting process is:

- Consensus based
  - Science based
    - Transparent





- OIE standards are **adopted** by the World Assembly of Delegates
- But there are a lot of 'actors' prior to adoption

- OIE experts: OIE Ad hoc Groups, Working Group, Reference Centre experts;
- OIE Delegates (and their National Focal Points)
- Regional and international organisations



- 3 year term (current term 2018-2021)





Topic / Issue / problem identified by Delegates, OIE Specialist Commissions, international/regional organisations, industry, scientists....e.g.

- new scientific information, e.g. from research or disease outbreak
- new diseases emerging
- new approach to control, e.g. vaccination







Code Commission reviews comments, revises text and recirculates for further comment or proposes for adoption.

'Normally' two cycles to adoption is (2-4 years) Fast track can be 1 year



Review comments & revise texts; Report sent to Members including texts for adoption and comment


**Members** review texts to be proposed for adoption and develop position


## **Role of OIE Delegate**

- 2. Conduct in-country consultation on proposed amendments with relevant stakeholders;




## Total number of MCs that submitted comments to Aquatic Animal Commission reports, 2012-2017

#### **Coordination Procedure: Steps and Timeline**

This timeline indicates the process in the lead-up to the General Session in May each year.

#### Coordination Procedure starts from March

#### April

MC wishing to have regional support share its comment via the System with clear indication of the intention.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> week, May

President summarise MCs' positions and comments, reports to RCG.

Other MCs make comments on the proposal using the System.

(at least two MCs' supports needed)

#### **Prior to GS**

President have a coordination meeting with RCG and other interested MCs to discuss the results and to prepare for the RC meeting.

MCs discuss and decide regional positions on key issues.

SCs' reports be posted on the System


#### 1<sup>st</sup> week, May
