- Historic role of the OIE is improved animal health (AH)
- Animal Welfare is a key component of AH

Why not before?

- 175 OIE Members In more than 120 countries Animal Welfare was not a priority
- Animal Welfare is not as yet part of the WTO/SPS Agreement
- Inadequate Animal Welfare science on which global standards could be based Oil

Evolution of the OIE animal welfare agenda

- ≥2000: Animal Welfare was recognised as a strategic priority in the 3rd OIE Strategic Plan 2001-2005;
- ≥2002: The OIE World Assembly of National **Delegates** adopted Resolution leading to the creation of a permanent working group (AWWG);

2003: The general principles were

1st OIE Global Conference of AW

- >2004: The 1st OIE Global Conference on Animal Welfare was held Paris:
- >2005: The 5 animal welfare standards were adopted;
 - The transport of animals by land
 - The transport of animals by sea
 - The transport of animals by air
 - The slaughter of animals for human

- > The Conference reviewed the state of animal welfare legislation and practices worldwide and identified specific challenges in several regions countries
- > More than 400 participants attended the Conference from all parts of the world

The 2nd OIE Global Conference

ROLL Members identified a need for support in several areas including:

- > Legislation and law enforcement;
- >Education and training. especially for official veterinarians:
- >Good governance through OIE initiatives such as the Evaluation of Performance of Veterinary Services (OIE PVS) and the OIE Twinning Programme for Laboratory and 3/1 Gollaborating Centers

The 2nd OIE Global Conference

- Results promotion of collaboration and partnerships with other organisations and stakeholder including industry, NGOs
 - > Development of animal welfare strategies in the regions and sub regional in close collaboration with donors;
 - > Promotion of practical and relevant research through the OIE Collaborating centers on AW in Italy, New Zealand,

Thile and Uruguay.

Current and future OIE WP on AW

- mplementation of Resolutions from the 2nd OIE Global Conference
 - > OIE support for the Universal Declaration on Animal Welfare (Resolution XIV, 75th General Session).
 - Increase involvement of scientific community and understanding of regional issues through OIE Collaborating Centres on Animal Welfare;
 - Maintain and strengthen existing procedures

Current and future OIE WP on AW

- Regional and sub regional AW Actions funded through the OIE World Animal Health and Welfare Fund (Animal Welfare Strategies for the respective RECs in Africa)
- > Training of OIE National Focal Points for animal welfare
- New chapter on the Use of Animals in Research and Education to be proposed for adoption at the 2010 OIE World Assembly

Current and future OIE WP on AW

- (3) Campaign, Advocacy and Lobbying to influence of Governments and stakeholders to comply to best practices
 - Continuing to promote good animal welfare situation globally through the OIE democratic and transparent process of adoption of science based standards.
 - > Ad hoc Groups to work on developing standards on livestock production systems (dairy cattle, pigs, laying hens);

CONCLUSION

- ➤ Relationship between Human and Animal Welfare ... Animals cannot have better lives than their owners
- ➤ Trade and access to markets Poor countries concerns.... avoid "parachuting" irrelevant knowledge
- Capacity BuildingTraining of Trainers (ToTs).... engage animal owners, workers, rural communities etc
- ➤ **Dispute settlement** use current OIE AW standards to advice on disputes arising from to trade arrangements.
