Objective

The workshop aims at assisting and guiding the country in undertaking concrete steps towards implementing a multi-sector “One Health” National Action Plan (NAP) on AMR in line with Global Action Plan (GAP) on AMR

Outputs

1. Progress of implementation of the NAP on AMR is assessed within the different focus areas and stages of the FAO Action Plan AMR
 2. Capacities of the national key stakeholders on AMR management are strengthened
 3. The FAO PMP AMR tool is finalized and assessed by the relevant stakeholders

Output 1: Progress of implementation of the NAP on AMR is assessed within the different focus areas and stages of the FAO Action Plan AMR

- 1.1 : Assess progress within the “raising awareness” area of the FAO Action Plan AMR
 - 1.2: Assess progress within the “increasing surveillance capacities” area of the FAO Action Plan AMR
 - 1.3: Assess progress within the “developing governance structures” area of FAO Action Plan AMR
 - 1.4: Assess progress within the “promoting the prudent use of antimicrobials” area of the FAO Action Plan AMR

Output 2: Capacities of the national partners on AMR management are strengthened

- 2.1. Elaborate a dashboard that displays gaps and critical control points for NAP implementation
 - 2.2. Generate an assessment report that defines specific actions to be taken to escalate AMR management

Output 3: The FAO PMP AMR tool is finalized and assessed by relevant stakeholders
