





Terrestrial Manual: Standards for laboratory diagnostic methods and requirements for the production and control of vaccines




Terrestrial Manual Chapter 3.1.17







- Update existing diagnostic tests
- Include direct rapid immunohistochemistry test (dRIT)
- Include PCR (Conventional and real-time)
- > Update vaccine's section
 - Injectable
 - Oral use (Wildlife, dog, baits)










Terrestrial Code Chapter 8.14 Infection with Rabies Virus

Self-declaration of freedom from rabies



Self-declaration of freedom from rabies (All species or dogs)

A self-declaration of disease freedom is an evidence-based documented statement from the OIE Delegate under his/her responsibility.

- ➤ Documented **compliance** with the provisions of Chapter 1.6. and to Articles 8.14.2. or 8.14.4. of the *Terrestrial Code*
- ➤ Standard Operating Procedure on the publication of self-declarations
