

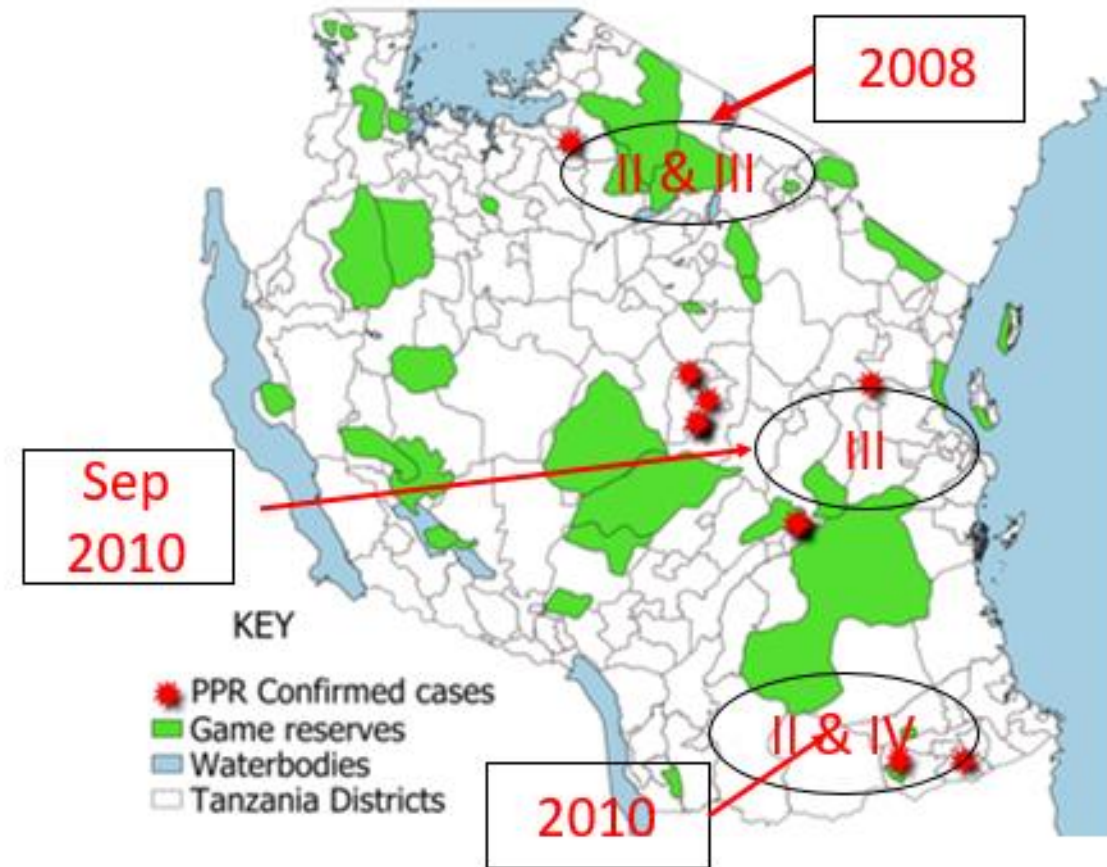

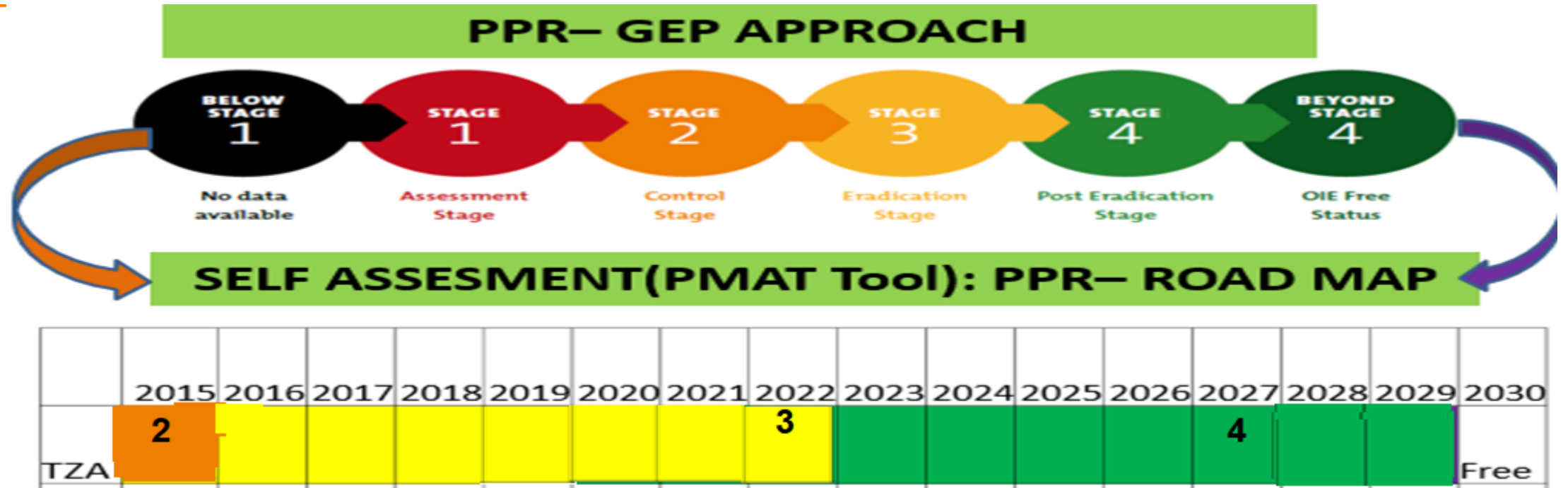

- Disease control was under public domain
- D by D policy in 1990s privatized some services
- General PPP Act of 2010 enacted
 - Private vaccine manufacturing industry
- Veterinary Services instruments reflecting PPP
 - Vaccine and Vaccination Regulations of 2020
 - Guideline for vaccination using (PPP)
 - Guideline for importation and distribution of vaccines
