# 1. Inputs into GBADs Ethiopia activities



### **Advisory Group**

**Established:** May 2021 at the approval of Dr Fikru Regassa, State Minister of Livestock Resources, Ministry of Agriculture (MoA)

#### Role

- Provide guidance to ensure that the case study focus matches national/international stakeholder needs
- Facilitate stakeholder engagement to ensure the utility of GBADs for decision-makers
- Encourage stakeholder cooperation to facilitate access to relevant data
- Support buy-in for GBADs from public authorities and other partners in Ethiopia

# Workshop – Inception

**Date:** 18 March 2021

**Location:** ILRI Addis Ababa campus

### Objective(s)

- Introduce GBADs and the Ethiopia case study, to understand to what extent livestock policies are currently informed by economic information
- Identify key priorities of main stakeholders with regards to activities of GBADs in Ethiopia.

### **Key feedback**

- Need for animal health economic training was identified by local stakeholders
- Need to develop a systematic way to tap into the wealth of data resource in the country
- The production system for the case study to focus on should be determined in consultation with national stakeholders



## **Workshop – National stakeholders**

Date location: 02 November 2022

**Location:** ILRI Addis Ababa campus

### **Objectives**

Present and review work done since start of case study

• Prioritise possible follow-up work of value to national stakeholders.

### Key feedback

- Disease burden estimates (and the dashboards) are useful for disease control policy making and lobbying investment into the livestock health sector
- Need for disaggregation of the disease burden estimations by disease and by subnational (Ethiopian region)
- There is a need for Disaggregation of burden by specific causes (PPR, FMD etc.) and including trade and public burden of these diseases
- More engagement with Ministry of Agriculture as the main stakeholder involving senior officials and designating a focal person for GBADs within the ministry

A second GBADs stakeholder workshop is planned for early May 2023



### **Stakeholder interviews**

Interviews of 11 individuals from the public and private sector were conducted in July 2022

**Purpose** – Assess the relevance of GBADs work and to identify ways to align case study with stakeholder needs

#### Response

- Overall response to the GBADs work was positive
- Outputs are seen as filling a gap in data and information for the Ethiopian livestock sector

#### Recommendations to strengthen and sustain the progress

- GBADs should work with the government to nominate a focal point to keep continuous communication and coordination flow between the ministry and GBADs
- Further support is provided in training, economic evaluations and dashboard development
- Institutionalization of economic assessment capacity is promoted within the veterinary authority
- There is a long-term vision and presence to ensure the fruition of GBADs objectives

Discussions are ongoing with MoA and aLIVE programme to enhance further collaboration and to embed and mainstream GBADs within the ministry



# 2. Capacity building on economics of animal health



## **Animal Health Economics Training**

**First training** (28 - 30 June 2021)

Topics covered – Introduction to AHE, impacts of animal diseases, estimation of disease burden/loss and understanding and using GBADs information

Second training (18-20 April 2022)

Topics covered

- Economic analysis tools for evaluation of animal health interventions
  - Economic assessment of short-term changes: Gross margin analysis, partial budget analysis)
  - > Economic assessment of long-term changes: discounting and cost benefit analysis
- Impacts of animal diseases
- Estimation of disease burden/loss
- Value chain approach to animal disease risk management
- Presentation and communication of economic evaluations for policymakers

Participants: 13 staff from five government institutions (MoA, MOTI, NAHDIC, EIAR, CVMA)



# Core expert team on PPR economic assessment

Initiated at the request of the GBADs Advisory Group and established by the MoA

**Objective** – Assess the economic impact of PPR (a national disease targeted for control) to generate concrete evidence that could support financing decisions of control programs by different stakeholders

#### Role

- Agree on the relevant impacts and approaches to estimate economic impact of PPR
- Identify data needs, map data sources, and plan data collection

### **Activities**

- Three coaching sessions given to the core expert team members
- Data collection and analysis is ongoing
