- The Federal Department of Veterinary and Pest Control Services (FDV&PCS) was created in 2014 from the defunct Department of Livestock and Pest Control Services (DL&PCS)
- The Department derive its mandate from the Animal Disease Control Act 2022 and the WOAH codes of standards and regulations
- The Department Functions as a policy adviser to Government on matters relating to animal health and veterinary public health

Project/Programme Objectives

1. National TADs Vaccination Programme and funders)

2.National Veterinary Stockpile, equipment and consumables distribution

3. National Veterinary infracstructure Development (42 Primary animal health clinics, 3 Federal Medical Health centers)

4. Development of National Strategic Plan for Control of transboundatry and zoonotic diseases

- Procured assorted vaccines (CBPP 5Million doses, PPR- 12.5million doses , FMD 5,000 doses, NCD 5million doses)

- In collaboration with States & FCT carried out Flag off ceremony of 2022 Nationwide free mass vaccination campaign against Transboundary Animal Diseases in Five Geopolitical Zones
- Reviewed and signed into Law, Animal Disease Control Act, 2022 by President Muhammadu Buhari, the Commander- in-Chief of Armed Forces, Federal Republic of Nigeria
- Gazette of Breeder Farms, Hatcheries and Animal Feeds Establishment (Infectious Diseases and Related Health Hazards Prevention) Regulation, 2021
- Primary animal health Centers and federal Medical Centers facilities are meant to support States in the provision of animal healthcare service delivery at the grassroots levels for improved animal health, livestock production and productivity
- Distributed refrigerated vans free to butchers to change the ways meat is being transported to markets from slaughters labs and abattoirs in Nigeria
