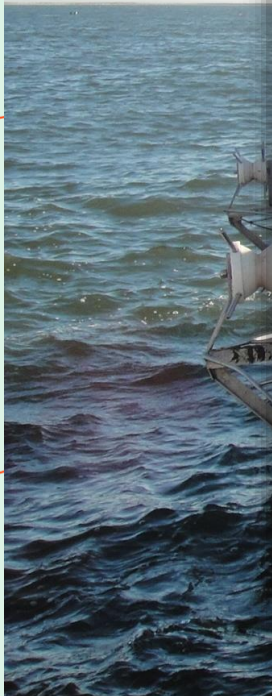

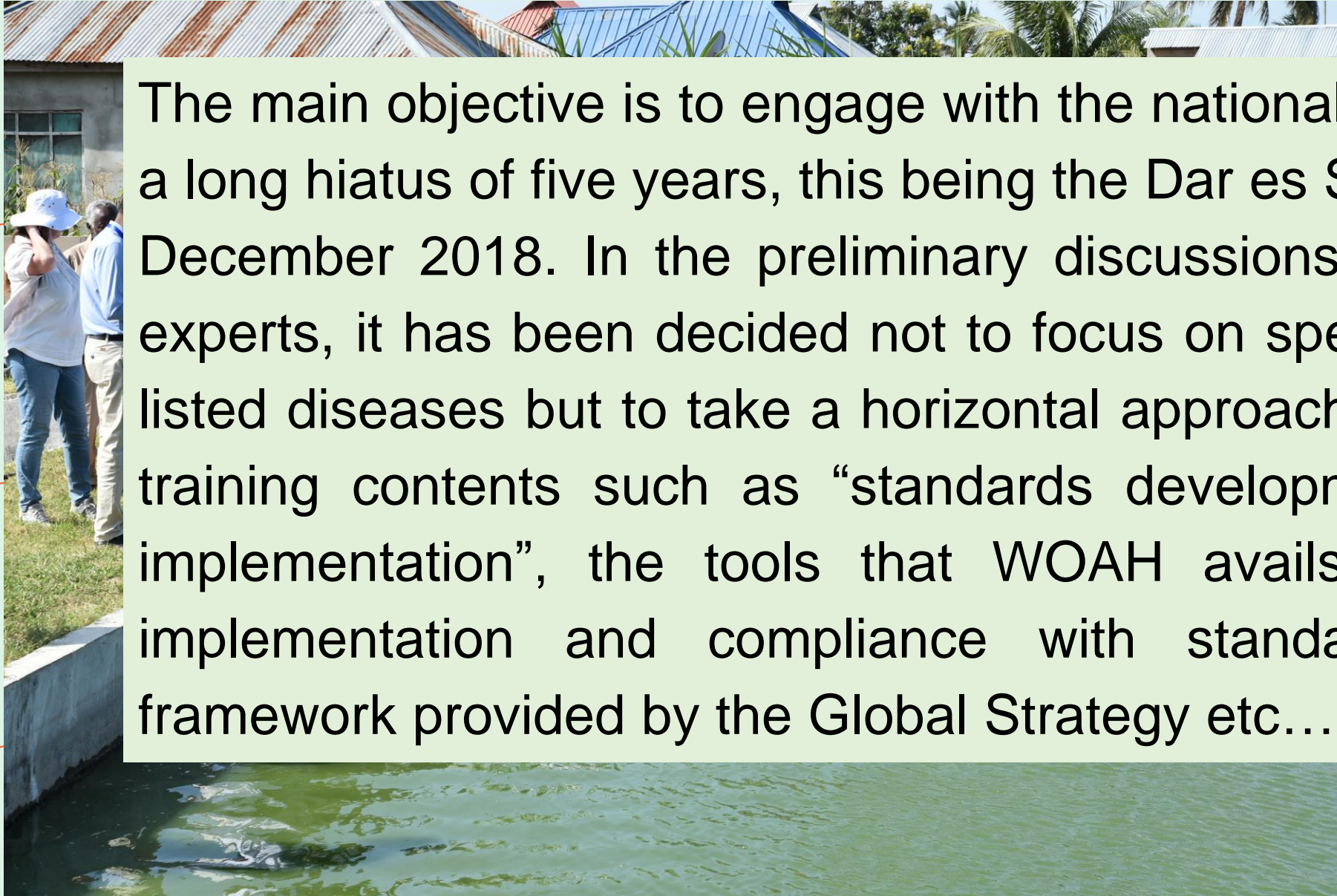




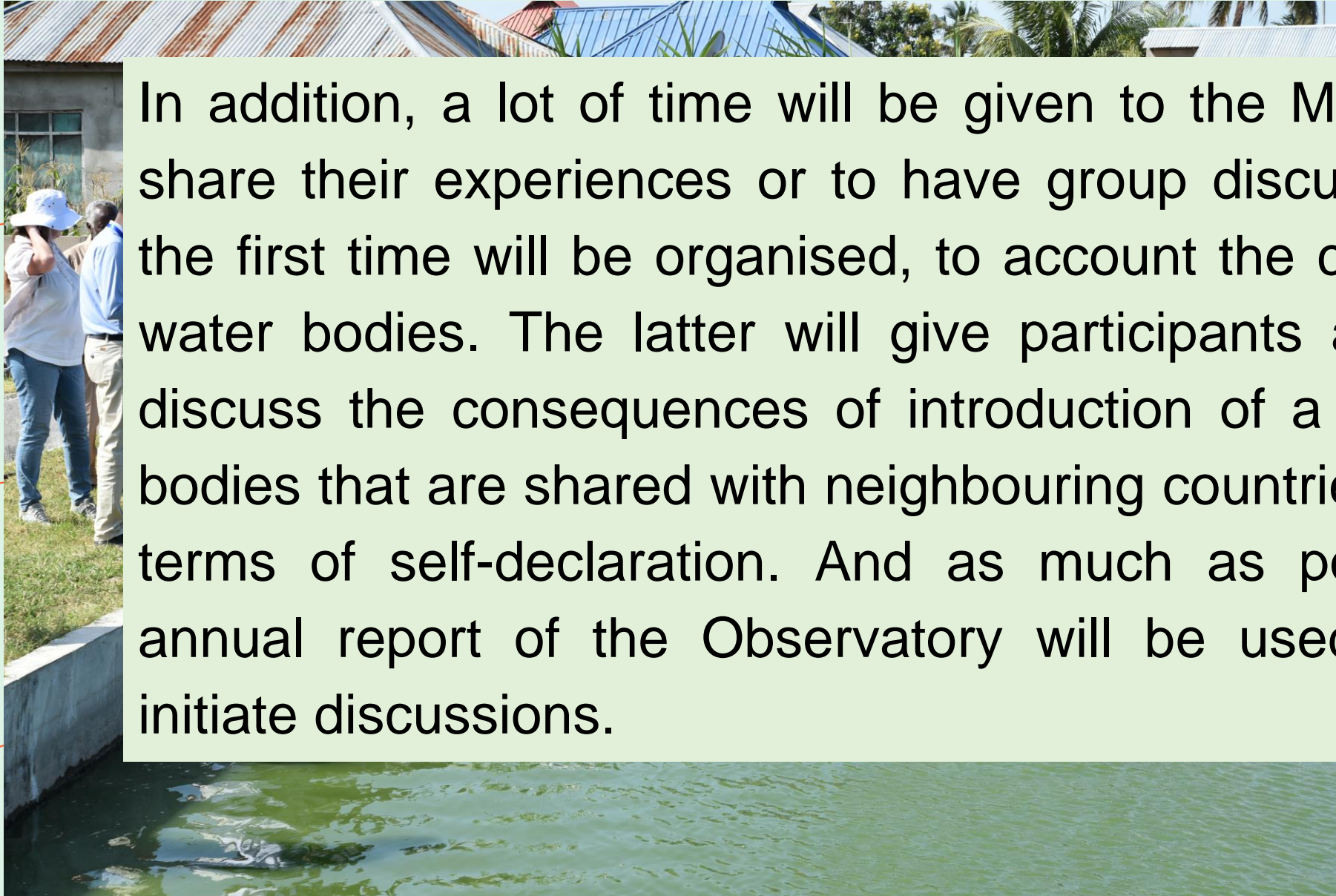








The main objective is to engage with the national focal points after a long hiatus of five years, this being the Dar es Salaam training of December 2018. In the preliminary discussions with the various experts, it has been decided not to focus on specific emerging or listed diseases but to take a horizontal approach to delivering the training contents such as “standards development”, “standards implementation”, the tools that WOAHA avails to support the implementation and compliance with standards, the global framework provided by the Global Strategy etc...



In addition, a lot of time will be given to the Members, either to share their experiences or to have group discussions, which for the first time will be organised, to account the concept of shared water bodies. The latter will give participants an opportunity to discuss the consequences of introduction of a disease in water bodies that are shared with neighbouring countries, for example in terms of self-declaration. And as much as possible the 2022 annual report of the Observatory will be used to generate or initiate discussions.



Finally, the meeting will be an opportunity to share the outcomes of the two first Regional Aquatic Animal Health Network meetings that have been organised for North, and for Southern Africa with the support of AU-IBAR.



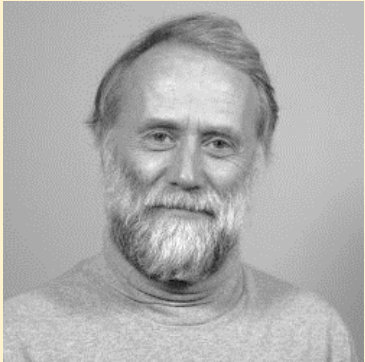
