


Objectives, focus/theme and expected outputs of the meeting

SGE-CBPP OBJECTIVES:

Strengthening Africa regional cooperation and dialogue on CBPP control through

- Regular information exchange;
- Technical support for regular review of national and regional CBPP control strategies, formulation of disease control policies, scientific guidance, cross-border surveillance, concerted risk management measures, identification of development priorities, awareness raising towards behavior change;
- promote regional collaboration on laboratory diagnosis, applied research e.g. epidemiology, biosecurity, socioeconomics and vaccine;
- Regular information sharing on the SGE outcomes to other Member Countries / stakeholders

SGE I (June 2023) discussed various issues and identified 6 key areas (technical items/topics) i.e.


- 1. Strategy
