


#### **WOAH Members' official CBPP status map**



Asia and the Pacific: 6



# Number and Proportion of Official recognised animal health status by WOAH









- Demonstration of compliance with WOAH international standards
- Guarantees to trading partners
- Facilitate safe trade of animals and their products
- Increase of economic potentialities and access to regional and international markets
- Demonstration of the quality of Veterinary Services
- Documented and updated evidence on the disease-free situation
- Objectives of the Global Strategies (FMD, PPR and dog-mediated rabies)

**Based on WAHIS SMR reporting of the last** five years, indication of having a national control programme for CBPP.




# **WOAH Endorsement of Disease Control Programmes**

- Increased engagement of governments in disease control and elimination.
- Visibility for facilitation and access to international funding.
- Opportunities for stronger coordination in disease control and elimination at regional level.

# Article 11.5.3 : CBPP free country or zone

To qualify for inclusion in the existing list of CBPP free countries and <u>zones</u>, a Member Country should:

- 1. have a record of regular and prompt animal disease reporting;
- 2. send a declaration to the WOAH stating that:
  - i. there has been no outbreak of CBPP during the past 24 months;
  - ii. no evidence of CBPP infection has been found during the past **24 months**;
  - iii. no vaccination against CBPP has been carried out during the past 24 months,
  - and supply documented evidence that surveillance for CBPP in accordance with this chapter is in operation and that regulatory measures for the prevention and control of CBPP have been implemented;
- 3. not have imported since the cessation of vaccination any animals vaccinated against CBPP.





# • Questionnaire layout: CBPP-free status

#### Chapter 1.10 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code

- 1. Introduction: Geographical features, Livestock demographics, Wildlife demographics and Slaughterhouses/abattoirs, markets and events associated with the congregation of susceptible livestock (e.g., fairs, shows, competitions)
- **2. Veterinary system:** Legislation, *Veterinary Services, Animal identification*, registration, traceability and movement control
- **3. CBPP eradication**: History and a description of how CBPP was controlled and eradicated (e.g., slaughter policy, zoning, vaccination, movement control)
- 4. CBPP diagnosis
- 5. CBPP surveillance
- 6. CBPP prevention
- 7. Control measures and contingency planning







# Article 11.5.18: WOAH endorsed official control programme for CBPP

**Overall objective**: Members to progressively improve their situation and eventually attain CBPP free status. The official control programme should be **applicable to the entire country**.

- 1. Have record of regular and prompt animal disease reporting
- 2. Capacity of the Veterinary Services to control CBPP
- 3. Detailed plan of the programme to control and eventually eradicate CBPP
  - i. Timeline, SMART performance indicators,
  - ii. documentation indicating that the programme has been implemented and is applicable to the entire territory;

#### 4. Epidemiology of CBPP

- i. Highlight current knowledge and gaps
- ii. Measures to prevent introduction, rapid detection of, and response to, all CBPP outbreaks;
- iii. Main livestock production systems and movement patterns of bovine and their products within and into the country
- **5. CBPP surveillance** diagnostic capacity and procedures, regular submission of samples to a laboratory according to the Terrestrial Manual provisions.
- **6. CBPP vaccination** compulsory vaccination of selected populations, vaccination campaign information (vaccination coverage, vaccines used, timeline for cessation of vaccination)
- 7. Emergency preparedness and contingency response plan in case of CBPP outbreaks



# Questionnaire layout: WOAH endorsement of control programme

- 1. Introduction
- 2. Veterinary system
- 3. Official control programme for CBPP submitted for WOAH endorsement

A concise plan of the measures for the control and eventual eradication of CBPP in the country, including:

- a) Epidemiology
- b) CBPP surveillance
- c) CBPP diagnosis
- d) Strategies
- e) CBPP prevention
- f) Control measures and emergency response



### The Procedure

Voluntary application - Submission of dossier by Members Preliminary screening by Status Department Evaluation by the ad hoc Group Evaluation by the Scientific Commission for Animal Diseases Communication of the outcome by Director General Official recognition by the World Assembly of Delegates (if positive outcome)



# The procedure: submission of an application

#### **WOAH** calendar meetings:

- Cycle from a General Session to the following one
- Letter from the DG after each General Session announcing dates of the AHG
- Deadline to submit dossier: 2 months before the meeting of the AHG
