CAHW Working Definition

A person selected from or by their own community and provided with short, initial or recurring vocational training to perform basic animal health and animal husbandry-related services, in line with national animal welfare standards.

CAHWs operate on a fee-for-service basis or some other means, are accountable to a registered veterinarian, a registered veterinary paraprofessional or an appropriate official and are active in their community. CAHWs can also play an important role in a range of sanitary tasks such as disease reporting.

The Role of CAHWs



Basic Veterinary Worker (BVW) Training for Afghanistan, 1992

Found primarily where there are insufficient numbers of vets and VPPs or where vets and VPPs are unwilling or unable to go, both in peacetime and in periods of civil unrest.

Last mile service delivery for animal keepers in underserved areas and communities

- Extension services
- Basic animal health care
- Preventive care

Support for public good functions

- Disease surveillance and reporting
- Disease control and eradication
- Emergency response



Numbers of CAHWs

- WOAH Members reporting CAHWs in 2018 to WAHIS: 51
- Countries in Africa that report more than 1000 CAHWs: 9
- Countries in Asia that report more than 1000 CAHWs: 4

Recognition of CAHWs

- # of countries where CAHWs are recognized in national legislation: 16
- # of countries where CAHWs benefit from supportive policies/guidelines though they are not formally recognized in national legislation: 13
- # of countries where CAHWs are trained and/or used by government services on an informal basis: 14


