

Key challenges

- Occurrence of Transboundary Animal Diseases (TADs) in crossborder areas
- Increasing SPS requirements by importers
- Inadequate collaboration and coordination for harmonized management of TADs
- Inadequate resources- financial and human for harmonized crossborder management of TADs

1. IGAD Sheikh Technical Veterinary School and Reference Centre (ISTVS)

- Established in 2002 by Terra Nova, adopted by IGAD in 2012- regional reach
- Objective is to conduct training and research, in collaboration with other institutions, to facilitate the sustainable use of resources in arid and semi-arid areas in member countries of IGAD
- It is affiliated with the Universities of Makerere (Uganda), Nairobi (Kenya) and Mekelle (Ethiopia) and has built solid institutional and academic links with other higher education bodies both regionally and internationally.
- Offer 3-year courses: i) a Diploma in Animal Health Sciences and ii) a Diploma in Development and Business for Animal Health Products.













Deployment by governments

- ISTVS graduates are deployed by the government of Somalia and development partners- UN agencies, NGOs, CBOs
- Other graduands further education to obtain BVM, Masters etc from collaborating aforementioned universities
- Become trainers in other universities- Burao University, Hargeisa,
 Mogadishu etc after further vertical training



Trainings of public and private sector Veterinary Para-Professionals

- Harmonized disease surveillance, vaccination and disease reporting (28 of whom 7 were female)
- Protocol for information sharing on cross-border animal health and sanitary measures between Ethiopia and Kenya (20 of whom 6 were female)
- Training on SMP-AH, quarantines (96 of whom 17 were female)
- Training on SOP in laboratory diagnostics (75 of whom 12 were female)
- Risk-Based and Syndromic Animal Disease Surveillance (24 of whom 6 were female)















3. Utilization of resilient veterinary workforce in the region

i. Memoranda of understanding

- Facilitated signing of 6 bilateral (ET-KE, DJ-ET, ET-Som, ET-SSD, ET-SD and SSD-SD) and 1 multilateral (ET-KE-SSD-UG) MoUs on cross border cooperation on animal health and sanitary measures and
- Developed implementation frameworks to operationalize the signed MoUs.













ii. Synchronized vaccinations

- Launched synchronized vaccination against priority TADs between Ethiopia- Kenya, Kenya-Uganda and Djibouti-Ethiopia (by FAO) between 2019 and 2023; Animals Vaccinated: 37.8 million (Ethiopia, Kenya and Uganda) and 1.68 million beneficiaries (33% female).
- VPPs used as multi-disciplinary technical committees to operationalize MoUs













Challenges

- Inadequate deployment of veterinarians and VPPs by national governments and more so in vast ASAL regions, districts or counties compounded by poor infrastructure (road and internet) limited AHS provision
- High rate of skills drain from ASALs due to unfavorable working conditions
- Limited resources to continue training VPPs to create critical mass
- Inadequate private sector investment in ASALs towards animal health service provision due to harsh work environment
- Inadequate coordination between neighbor countries to utilize VPPs due to inadequate resources
- Conflict over natural resources which drives away AHS providers (public and private)
- Weak enforcement of national laws and policies towards AHSP in ASALs















Proposed solutions

- Advocate for improved development of infrastructure in ASALs- road and internet
- Continue resource mobilization- national and development partners to train, deploy VPPs to implement AHS provision
- Strengthen available peace committees for conflict resolution to assure retention of AHS providers (public and private)
- Strengthen operationalization of signed MoUs- good coordination employing digital mechanisms- group WhatsApp, emails, etc
- Advocate for adequate deployment of AHS providers in vast ASAL regions
