- Facilitates science-driven decision making by translating data into actions that support animal health



is the signature capacity building program of the Center for Animal Health & Food Safety of the University of Minnesota College of Veterinary Medicine (St. Paul, Minnesota USA).

The primary aims of the training are to build capacity of veterinary services by:

- Reaching (primarily) mid-career professionals who have demonstrated commitment to the work of veterinary services
- Combining technical training and applied project work to build knowledge, skills, and mindsets
- Re-enforcing the role that VS professionals have in supporting broader mechanisms of trade, public health, and One Health
- Encouraging critical evaluation and systems thinking approaches





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

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

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4 Ps

- PARTNERSHIP
- PRAGMATISM
- PROJECTS
- PARTICIPATION BEYOND THE PROGRAM







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PARTNERSHIP:

- Recruitment and selection of participants

 Helps ensure that trainee's roles align with local and national priorities and work plans
- Evaluation and guidance on materials creation and revision
- Planning and hosting of workshops and events to meet participant expectations and needs
- Furthers bidirectional understanding of the program for eventual local leadership and direction





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PRAGMATISM:

- Dual delivery: Canvas LMS and PDF eBooks/flashdrives
- Use of familiar tools alongside new ones
 - WhatsApp
 - Rounds via Zoom
- Data packages vs. stipends
- Stated policies for extensions, family leave, professional "pressure points"





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PROJECTS:

- Application opportunities for the course learnings: Knowledge, skills, systems thinking approaches
- Designed in partnership with local leadership to align with existing and desired priorities and plans
- Intended to make a practical impact on VS functioning
- As indicators of program impact a critical conversation for any entity involved in capacity building





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PARTICIPATION BEYOND THE PROGRAM:

- ProgRESSVet East Africa Alumni Network
 - Uganda and Kenya Chapters
 - Work areas: Continuing Education, Proposal Development, Ambassadors
- ProgRESSVet Symposium to showcase the contributions of alumni working in VS
- Ongoing access to updated material via Canvas





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Cohorts 1-3 (2020 - 2022) : 74 Trained

- 47 Kenya (80% retention rate)
- 27 Uganda (60% retention rate)
- Cohort 4 groups: 26 from Kenya, 29 from Uganda (100% retention, both cohorts)

Over 95% of the participants found the course content to be relevant to their current professional practice.

100% of participants indicated future value for their

learnings. Approximately 66% of respondents indicated that the material in the ProgRESSVet eBooks was relevant to their intended future professional practice, with 34% indicating that the content was "extremely" relevant to future practice.
