
Background



- Namibia launched National Rabies Control Strategy in 2015
- Pilot phase started in 2016 in Oshana region
- From 2017 onwards, rabies elimination activities was rolled out across 8 regions in the NCA
- Project support:
 - Govt of Germany and administered by WOAH
 - Govt of Namibia
 - Technical support provided by WOAH, FLI and other partners

Key activities of the project

- Capacity building
- Rabies awareness education
- Dog rabies vaccination
- Rabies surveillance







Public sector /DVS commitment to achieve dog mediated rabies elimination

GRN-Directorate of Veterinary Services provide:

- Annual budget to implementing Rabies vaccination campaigns:
 - -procuring of vaccines and provide rabies vaccination for free
 - -Recruitment of temporal workers- to form many teams
 - -Payment of staff Per diem and Salaries for permanents employee
- The GRN contribute about 80% of cost to implement rabies elimination







Community leaders' engagement in the rabies elimination program



- To encourage community ownership and support for the rabies control program.
- To increase rabies vaccination coverage and rabies surveillance.
- Impact not yet assessed in both region, but













have been vaccinated






- Coordinate rabies vaccination campaign between state and private veterinarian
- Supply vaccine and consumable items for the campaign
- Conduct rabies awareness in schools
- Total 11 650 dogs, 3 636 cats in 2024


