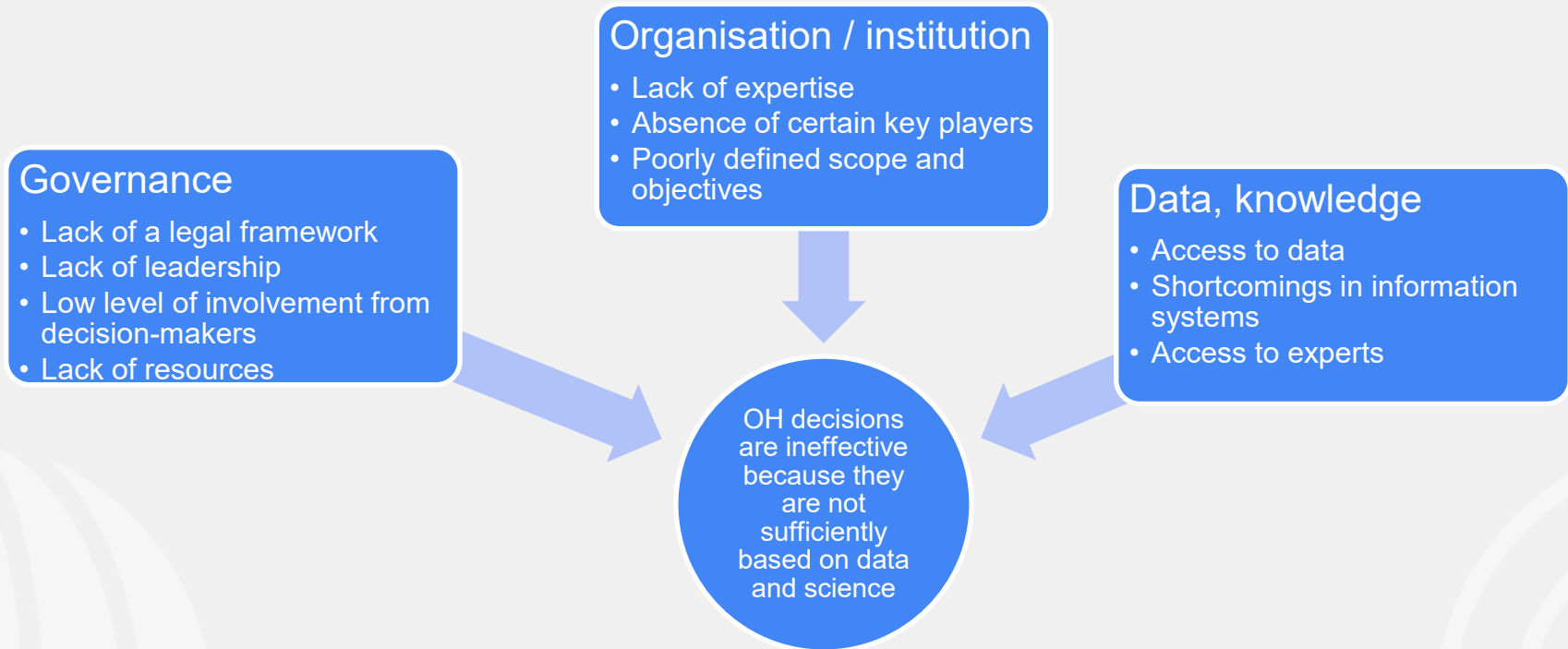

Exercise 5

1. Taking into account the identified priorities and targeted KPIs, define the activities to be implemented to achieve them according to three objectives corresponding to the three pathways:

Pathway 1: mandate, governance, funding, advocacy => **Objective 1: Improve governance (Mandate/Funding/Advocacy)**

Pathway 2: coordination, procedures, capacity, integration => **Objective 2: Establish an effective organisation (Capacity building, coordination, procedures, sectoral integration)**

Pathway 3: data, systems, sharing, knowledge exchange => **Objective 3: Facilitate access to scientific data and resources (Data, systems, sharing, knowledge exchange, scientific committees)**

Some quality criteria for the theory of change

- A collaborative and participatory process
- Focused on genuinely beneficial, sustainable and inclusive changes by seeking to strengthen the effectiveness of the institutions and mechanisms to be developed/strengthened
- An inclusive approach (women, vulnerable populations)
- Draws on evidence, knowledge and lessons learned from credible sources
- Identifies who does what among the key partners and stakeholders whose combined efforts will be necessary for change to take place
- Presents a plausible, clear and logical rationale to describe how the proposed interventions will bring about the desired change (solution tree)
