Africa veterinary Technicians Association (AVTA)

Is a membership organization whose aims are;

To promote and defended the interest of all Para veterinarians with a special interest in the Animal Resource industry to safeguard the profession in the African region



 To promote and improve the animal recourses industry through the Para-professional services.

 To act as the official voice of advocacy for the veterinary Para-profession



 To organize and facilitate meetings and other scientific exchange between members and member Associations regionally

 Provide and receive support from member veterinary Para –professional Associations.



MEMBERSHIP

1. Principle membership

 National veterinary Para-professional associations of countries recognized by the African Union, provided that such associations are private organizations funded mainly by subscriptions of its members and partnerships.



2. Private membership

 Include stakeholders and nongovernmental organizations that add value to the Animal Resource Industry to be admitted for a specified period but shall have no voting rights.



3. Associate membership

 Include National veterinary regulatory authorities, National regulators of the veterinary practice and Para veterinary associations/specialty groups that are not regarded as principal members.



4. Honorary membership.

 Offered to non-Para veterinarians whom the Association considers to have rendered outstanding service to the veterinary profession in the region.



5. Corporate membership

 Major regional sponsors and partners may be granted corporate membership for a specified period.



VETERINARY PARA-PROFESSIONAL(Oie definition)

 Means a person who, for the purposes for the terrestrial code, is authorized by the veterinary statutory body to carry out certain designated task (dependent upon the category of veterinary Para-professional)in a territory, and delegated to them under the responsibility and direction of a veterinarian.
