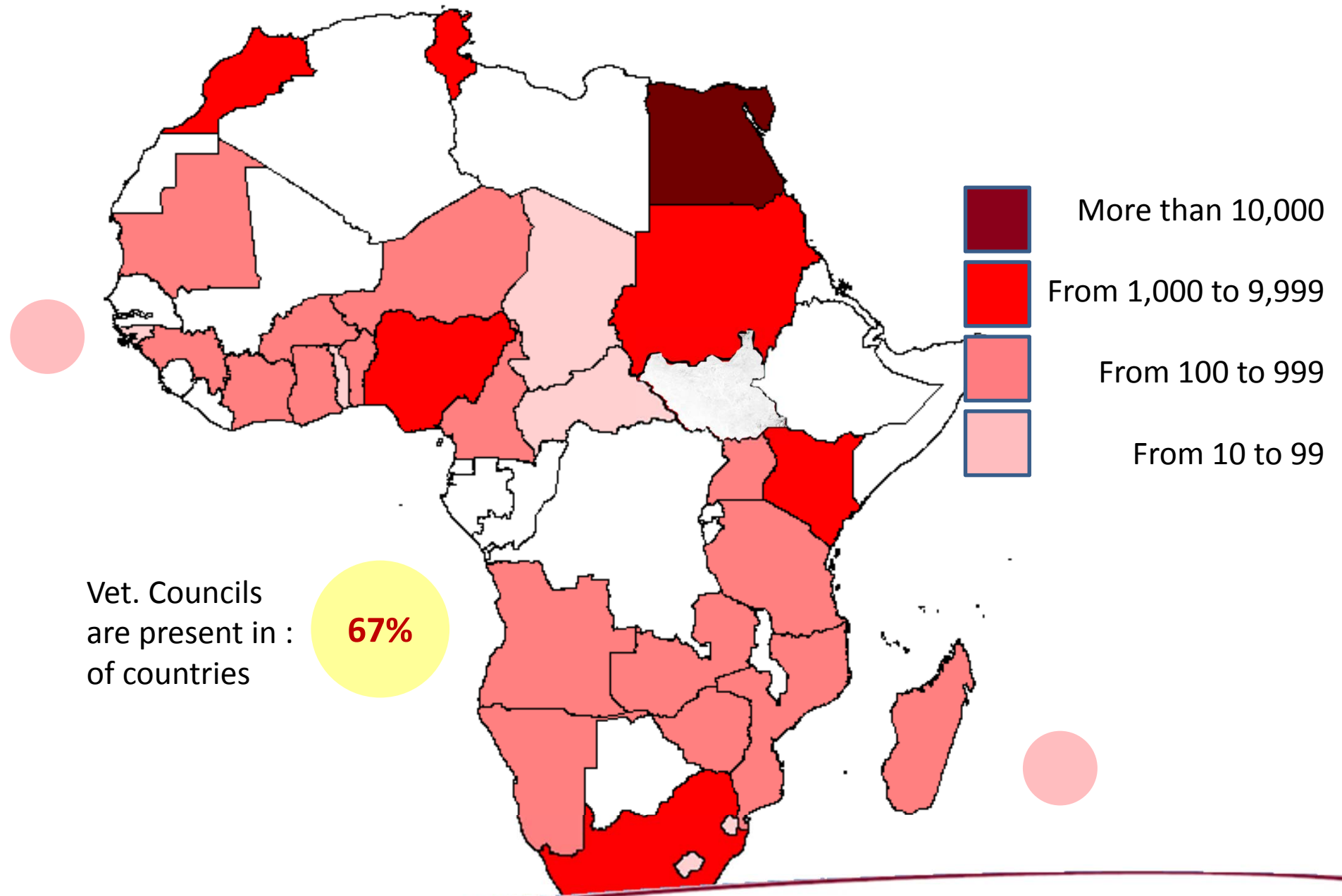

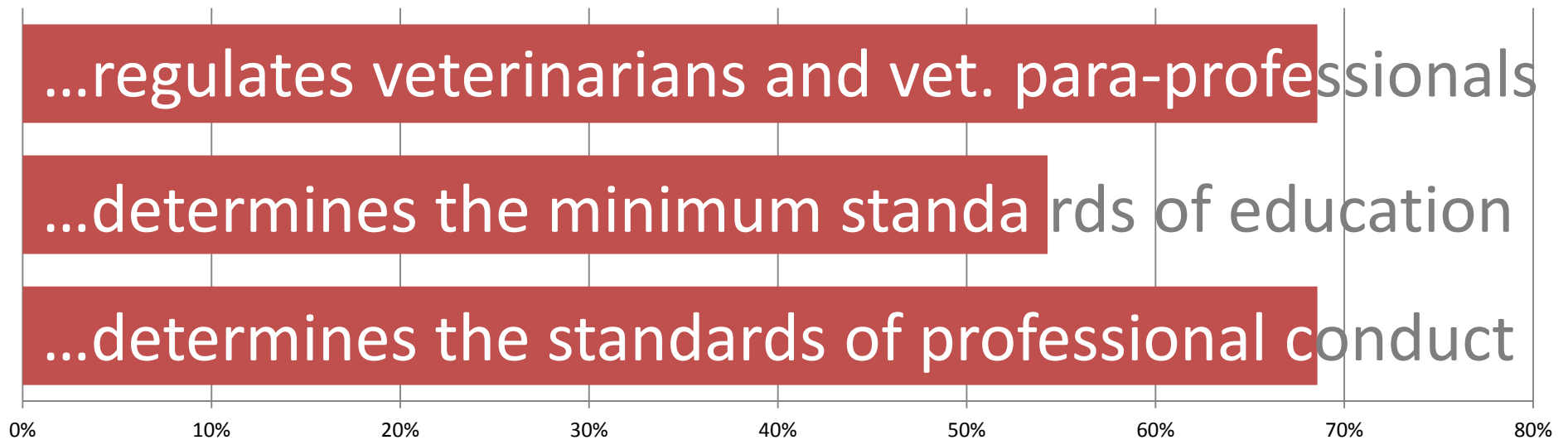


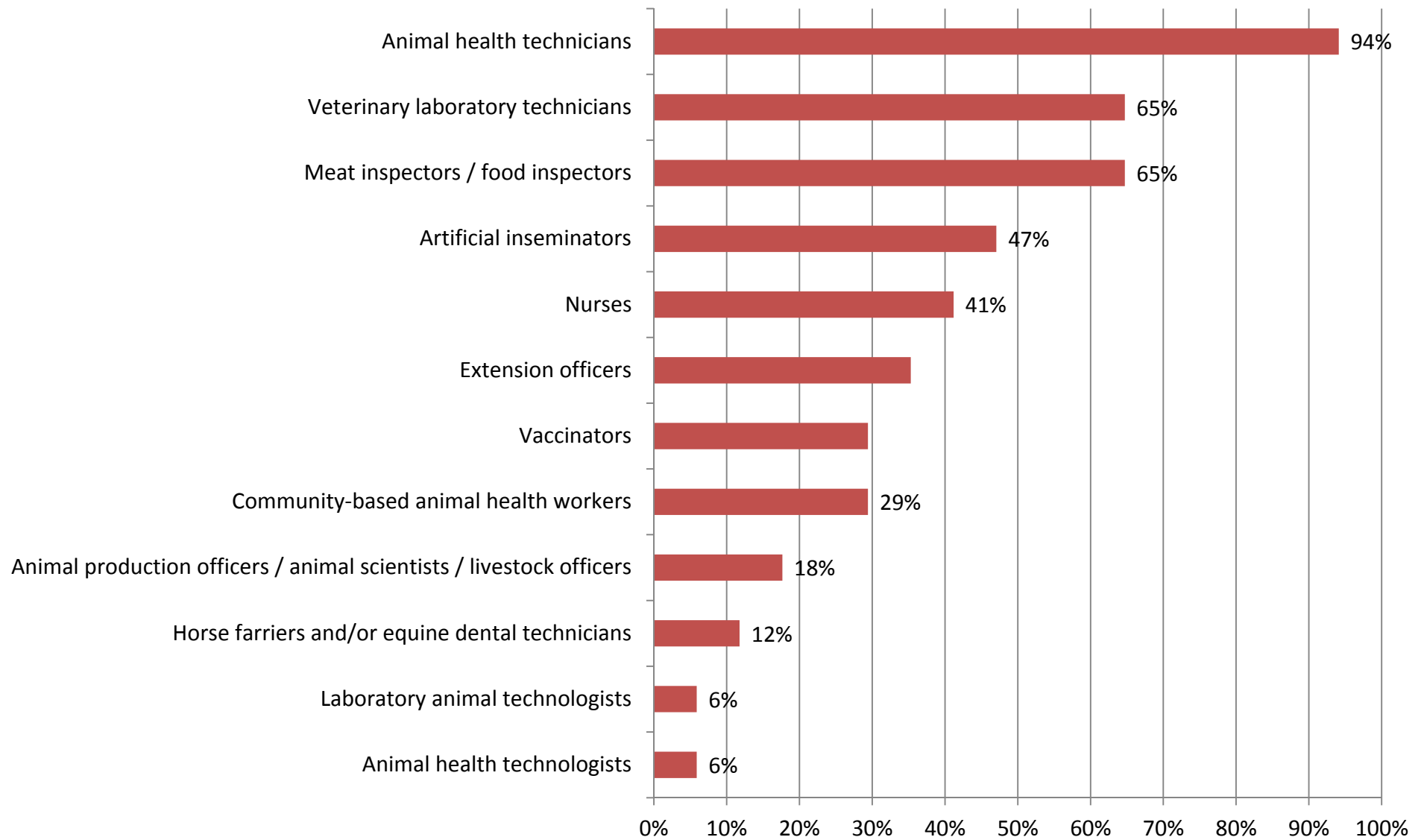
DEFINITION


A VETERINARY STATUTORY BODY (VSB) means an autonomous, regulatory body for veterinarians and veterinary para-professionals

The veterinary statutory body should be able to demonstrate that it has the capacity, supported by appropriate legislation, to exercise and enforce control over all veterinarians and veterinary para-professionals subject to its authority. These controls should include, where appropriate, compulsory licensing or registration, participation in the definition of minimum standards of education (initial and continuing) for the recognition of degrees, diplomas and certificates by the Competent Authority, setting standards of professional conduct and competence, investigating complaints and the application of disciplinary procedures





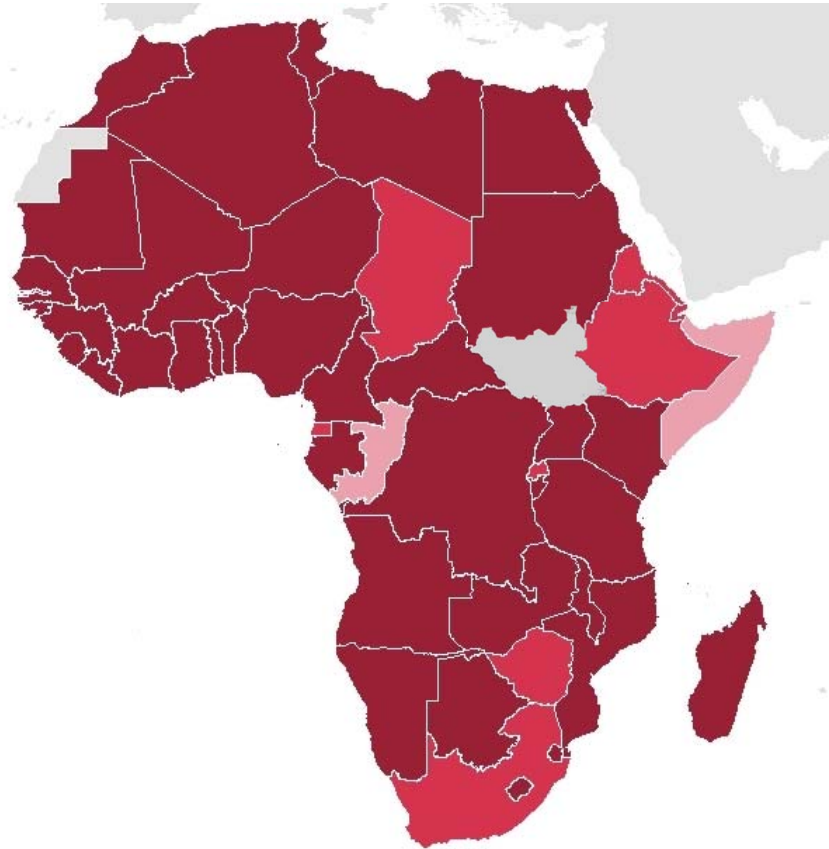

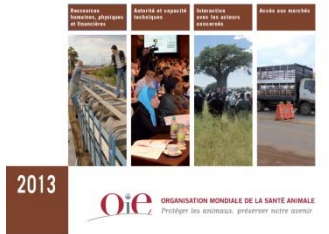

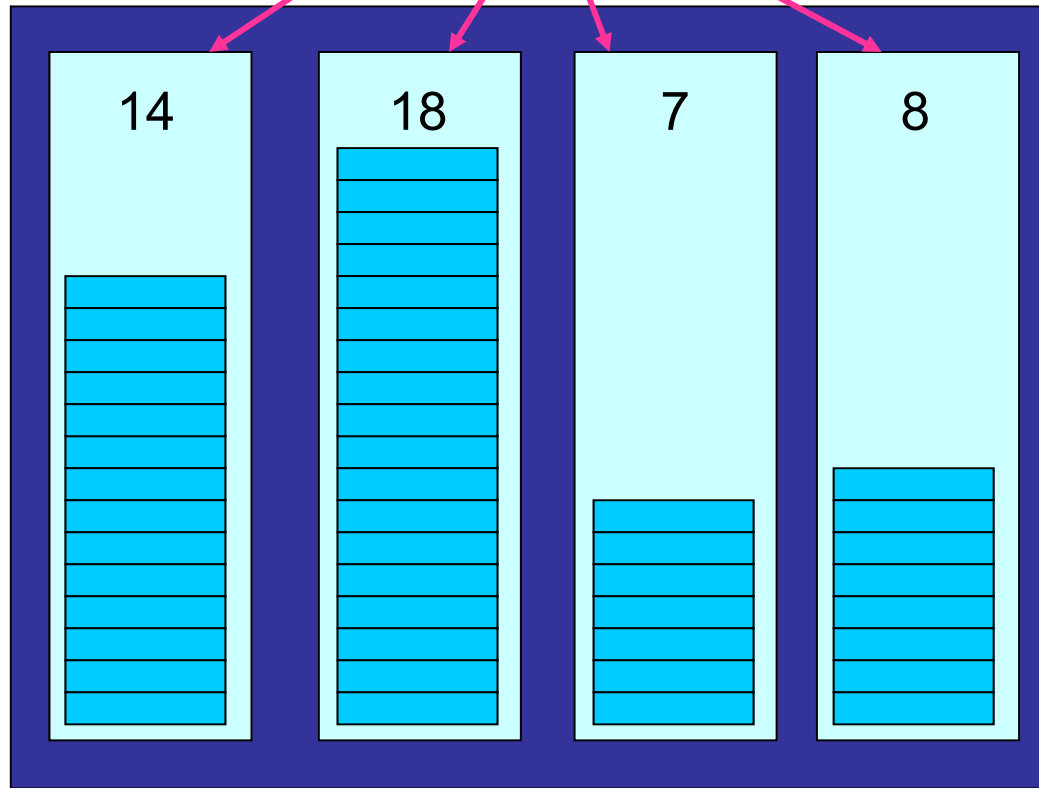

Pathway

I-1. The professional and technical staffing of the Veterinary Services

The appropriate staffing of the VS to allow for veterinary and technical functions to be undertaken efficiently and effectively.

A. Veterinary and other professionals (university qualification)

B. Veterinary para-professionals and other technical personnel

Levels of advancement

1. The majority of technical positions are not occupied by personnel holding appropriate qualifications.

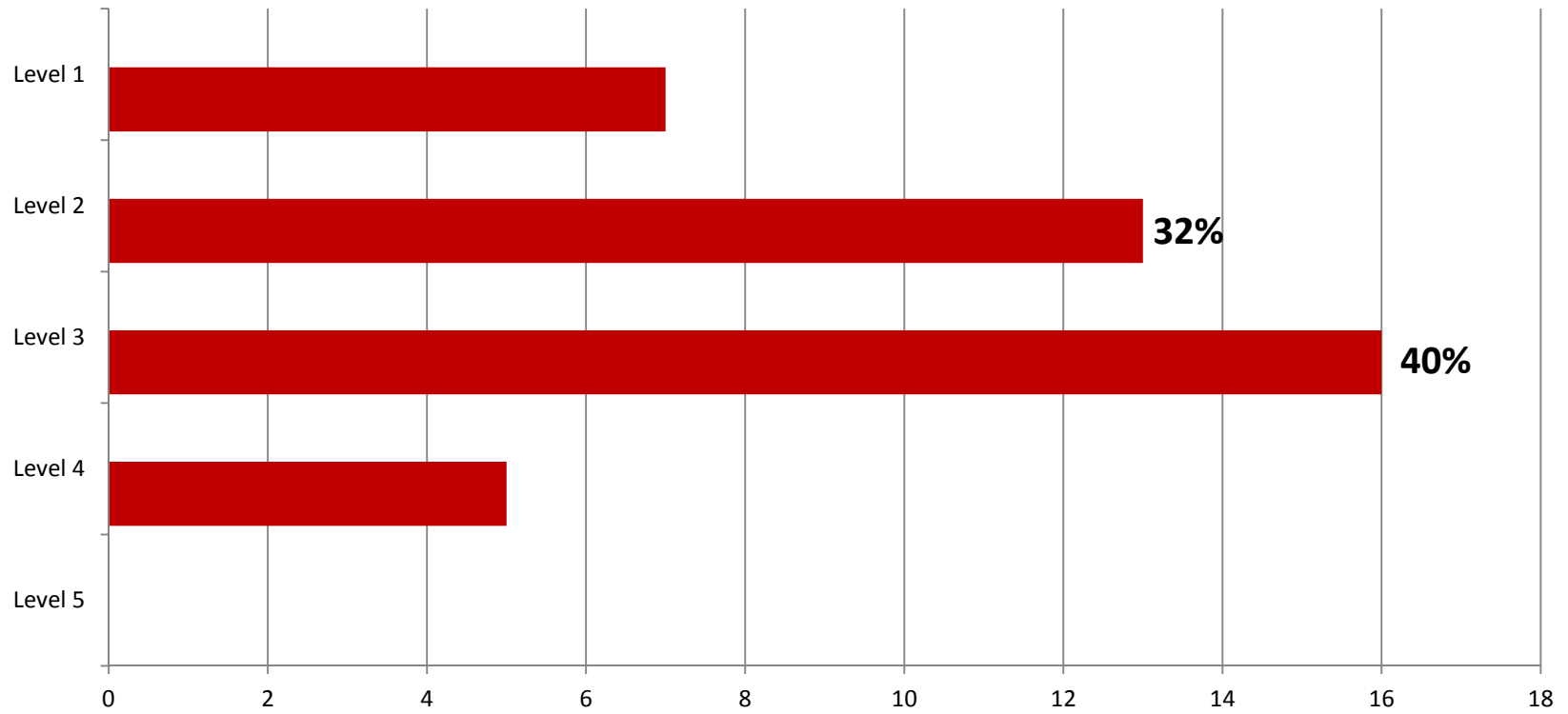
2. The majority of technical positions at central and state/provincial levels are occupied by personnel holding appropriate qualifications.

3. The majority of technical positions at local (field) levels are occupied by personnel holding appropriate qualifications.

4. The majority of technical positions are effectively supervised on a regular basis.

5. There are effective management procedures for formal appointment and performance assessment of veterinary para-professionals.

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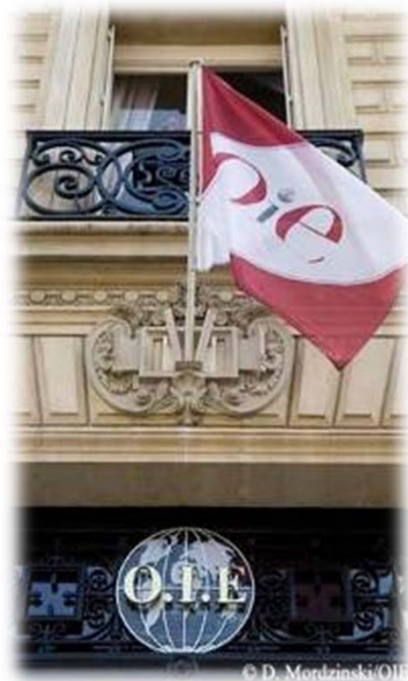
