SCENARIO: BONELESS BEEF

YOU ARE EXPORTING 'COUNTRY A'

You have received a request from a company in your country that would like to export boneless beef to 'Country X'.

Task:

- 1. Using the relevant chapters of the *Terrestrial Code*, develop the export health measures, based on the country disease statuses described below.
- 2. What additional information would you prepare and be willing to provide to the Veterinary Authority of the importing country, 'Country A' to support your disease status claims?
- 3. Once ready approach the 'Country A' Group and start the process of negotiation.

Your disease status:

- **Food and mouth disease (FMD)** is present and has been reported through WAHIS and an official control programme exists that has been endorsed by the OIE;
- OIE official recognition for controlled bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) risk;
- contagious bovine pleuropneumonia (CBPP) is present and has been reported through WAHIS.
- Brucella abortus is present and has been reported through WAHIS; and
- Rift Valley fever virus has been reported through WAHIS.

Country X (importing country) claims the following:

- OIE official recognition as country free from **foot and mouth disease (FMD)** where vaccination is not practised;
- OIE official recognition as country having a negligible BSE risk;
- OIE official recognition as country free from CBPP;
- **Brucella abortus** is present and has been reported through WAHIS and an official control programme exists; and
- Self-declared free of Rift Valley fever virus.

NOTE: For the purposes of this exercise no other diseases need to be considered.
