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## EU aquatic animal health legislation



- Council Directive 2006/88/EC on animal health requirements for aquaculture animals and products thereof, and on the prevention and control of certain diseases in aquatic animals:
  - Disease preventive measures
    - Farm authorisation, Record keeping, Biosecurity, Passive surveillance
  - Disease control
  - Placing on the market and **import rules**
- Covering fish, mollusc or crustacean

## Which species?

- **Susceptible species:** means any species in which infection by a disease agent has been demonstrated by natural cases or by experimental infection that mimics the natural pathways (listed in Directive 2006/88/EC)
- **Vector species:** means a species that is not susceptible to a disease but which is capable of spreading infection by conveying the pathogen from one host to another (listed in Regulation (EC) No 1251/2008)

## EU animal health import requirements



- EU veterinary legislation on imports is fully harmonised
  - Same imports requirements are applied by all MS
  - However, requirements will vary due to different health status in MS as regards non-exotic diseases
- Based on OIE standards
- The import rules mirrors the rules applicable to movements within the EU
- Facilitate trade and import while ensuring the animal health status in the EU




## Legal basis

- Commission Regulation (EC) No 1251/2008 implementing Directive 2006/88/EC as regards conditions and certification requirements for the placing on the market and the **import into the Community of aquaculture and products thereof and laying down a list of vector species**
- Commission regulation (EC) No 1250/2008 amending Regulation (EC) No 2074/2005 as regards **certification** requirements for import of fishery products, live bivalve molluscs, echinoderms, tunicates and marine gastropods **intended for human consumption**
- Commission Decision 2008/946/EC implementing Council Directive 2006/88/EC as regards requirements for **quarantine** of aquaculture animals

## Third country listing - import for farming purposes (including open ornamental facilities)

- Listing criteria
  - Legislation
  - Structure and powers of the competent veterinary authority
  - Assurances which the competent veterinary authority can give regarding compliance or equivalence with Community animal health conditions
  - Animal health status, in particular as regards exotic diseases
  - The regularity, speed and accuracy of notification of diseases, particularly the OIE listed diseases
  - Rules on the prevention and control of aquatic animal diseases and their implementation, including rules on imports from other countries
  - Rules and controls on the importation from other countries



## Third country listing - import for farming purposes (including open ornamental facilities)

- Inspection by the EU Food Veterinary Office (FVO) required before listing
- African countries listed (only live fish) in Annex III of Regulation (EC) No 1251/2008:
  - Congo
  - South Africa



## Third country listing - import to closed ornamental facilities

- Fish susceptible to listed diseases:
  - Same third country list as imports for farming (1251/2008)
- Non-susceptible fish + mollusc + crustaceans:
  - OIE member countries







### Consignments intended for human consumption



- Certificates set out in Regulation 2074/2005, last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1250/2008
- Disease freedom required
  - exotic diseases
  - non-exotic diseases when:
    - intended for a free area or an area under a surveillance or eradication programme in the EU
- Applicable to susceptible species
- Whole country, a zone or a compartment
- Freedom according to EU legislation or OIE standards




### HOWEVER,



- No disease specific requirements
  - Species in the consignment is not susceptible to any listed diseases
  - Directly intended for human consumption without further processing, provided that they are packed in retail-sale packages
  - For fish: slaughtered and eviscerated
  - For crustaceans/molluscs:
    - No longer able to survive as living animals if returned to the environment from which they were obtained, or
    - Intended for further processing in the Community when
      - Processed in establishments with effluent treatment system, or
      - Processed in establishments without temporary storage




### Consignments intended for farming



- Certificates set out in Regulation (EC) No 1251/2008 as amended by Regulation (EU) No 346/2010
- General requirements
  - Clinical inspection
  - Not subject to any prohibitions due to unresolved increased mortality
  - Not intended for destruction or slaughter for the eradication of diseases
  - In the case of molluscs, were subject to an individual check and no other molluscs were detected in the consignment




### Consignments intended for farming – disease specific requirements





- Freedom at place of origin, or
- Quarantine
  - Only in the case of wild susceptible species and vectors
  - At place of origin or place of destination
  - Complying with Decision 2008/946/EC
- Applicable to susceptible/vector species





### Ornamental aquatic animals



- Intended for open ornamental facilities
  - Same rules as for consignments intended for farming
- Intended for closed ornamental facilities
  - Quarantine is always an option
  - No requirements for vector species

**II.4 Transport and labelling requirements**
