Algeria

- □ Elaborated and approved the Executive Decree in October 2017 in order to create the National Multi-sectoral Committee on Antimicrobial Resistance as well as its mission and organisation.
- ☐ The National Multi-sectoral Committee is composed of 13 Ministries and 7 Public institutions. The National Multi-sectoral Committee is responsible to:
 - develop a national antimicrobial resistance plan and determine the mechanisms for its implementation;
 - > to coordinate, monitor and evaluate the activities planned in the national plan for antimicrobial resistance;
 - ➤ to propose any measure aimed at strengthening the national plan for combating antimicrobial resistance;
 - ➤ Initiate training, information, awareness and communication actions inherent in the fight against antimicrobial resistance;
 - > to propose any research action related to its missions.

Morocco

As part of the antimicrobial resistance (AMR) response, ONSSA (Office National de
Sécurité Sanitaire des produits Alimentaire) has launched a national AMR
surveillance and control program. Among the major achievements:
☐ Preparation in 2015 of an AMR control plan at the veterinary level;
☐ Preparation of an integrated national plan for AMR in collaboration with the
Ministry of Health. This plan has been technically validated in 2018 and is awaiting
for political validation;
☐ Total ban on antimicrobial use as a growth promoters in 2017
Improved Governance and traceability of the veterinary drugs
☐ Improved surveillance (especially in poultry industry)
☐ Increasing training and education of stakeholders to promote the implementation
of International Standards [e.g. revision of dossiers of some antibiotics approved
before (ex. Colistin) in line with the recommendations issued from the Global

conference in Marrakech]


Tunisia

- ☐ On 7 September 2019, the Tunisian Minister of Health and the Tunisian Minister of Agriculture, Water Resources and Fisheries signed the joint national action plan to fight **antimicrobial resistance (AMR).**
- ☐ The elaboration of the **joint national action plan** to fight **AMR** was the result of a two-year process started in 2017 and concluded in 2019.
- ☐ Progress was achieved <u>dedicated inter-sectoral working groups</u>, which included all stakeholders operating in the field.
