Rabies activities

- ❑ **July 2019: Regional North African meeting** to make progress on harmonisation of elimination strategies for dog-mediated rabies in humans
- ❑ **About 30 people**, comprising of animal and public health experts from Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia, along with representatives of Ministries of Home Affairs and/or of Local Government Areas, responsible for dog population management in municipalities.
- ❑ Representatives from national WHO country offices and experts from WHO Headquarters as well as from FAO Sub-Regional Representation for North Africa were invited.
- ❑ The Chief Veterinary Officer and OIE Delegate of Kenya and an expert from Namibia were also invited to share their experiences in fighting rabies
 - The objectives of the seminar were **to promote collaboration** between the Veterinary, the Public Health and the Local Government authorities under the One Health umbrella, in the control of rabies

Rabies activities

There were working sessions that paved the way for a final discussion where several common challenges and solutions were identified:

- ❑ To share data/information on topics related to rabies control (e.g. publications) ;
- ❑ To share national strategic plans and *standard operating procedures* (SOP);
- ❑ To celebrate “World Rabies Day” together (e.g. one country will invite representatives from neighbouring countries);
- ❑ To develop appropriate actions for targeting high risk areas such as rural / communal areas;
- ❑ To map all potential civil society stakeholders (e.g. NGOs) working in this field to be included/involved in the fight against rabies;
- ❑ To strengthen field capacities and research;
- ❑ To implement and better exploit the outcomes of pilot projects.


**Workshop on Surveillance and Control of Rabies

In the morning, the IZSve jointly with the Italian Ministry of Health and with the OIE/FAO REMESA Joint Secretariat based in Tunis, organizes an **online round table** to discuss with the 15 **REMESA** (*REseau MEditerranéen de Santé Animale*, the Mediterranean Animal Health Network) countries representatives and other international experts, the plans to be undertaken and strengthened with the aim of controlling canine rabies in the Mediterranean region.

North African OIE Regional meeting for strategy to fight Rabies (10 November 2020)



- ❑ Organised in the framework of REMESA
- ❑ Nearly 40 participants were present
- ❑ The purpose of the meeting was to establish the state of play of the activities carried out in the sub-region in order to create synergies and to propose new projects likely to have an impact on the ground, according to the expectations of the countries.

Rabies activities

The main issues highlighted during the workshop held on 10 November 2020 were as follows:

- ❑ Animal welfare component increasingly demanded by civil society;
- ❑ The control plans exist but the application of the plans remain to be improved;
- ❑ Epidemiological tracing of outbreaks (characterization of viral strains);
- ❑ Mass vaccination of accessible dogs remains the priority (they represent a high percentage of the dog population);
- ❑ Improve and digitalise communication / awareness campaigns
- ❑ The notion of responsible ownership was also discussed as important point in the control of canine rabies
- ❑ The public/private partnership was also a point mentioned in the strategies as well as the involvement of veterinary students.
