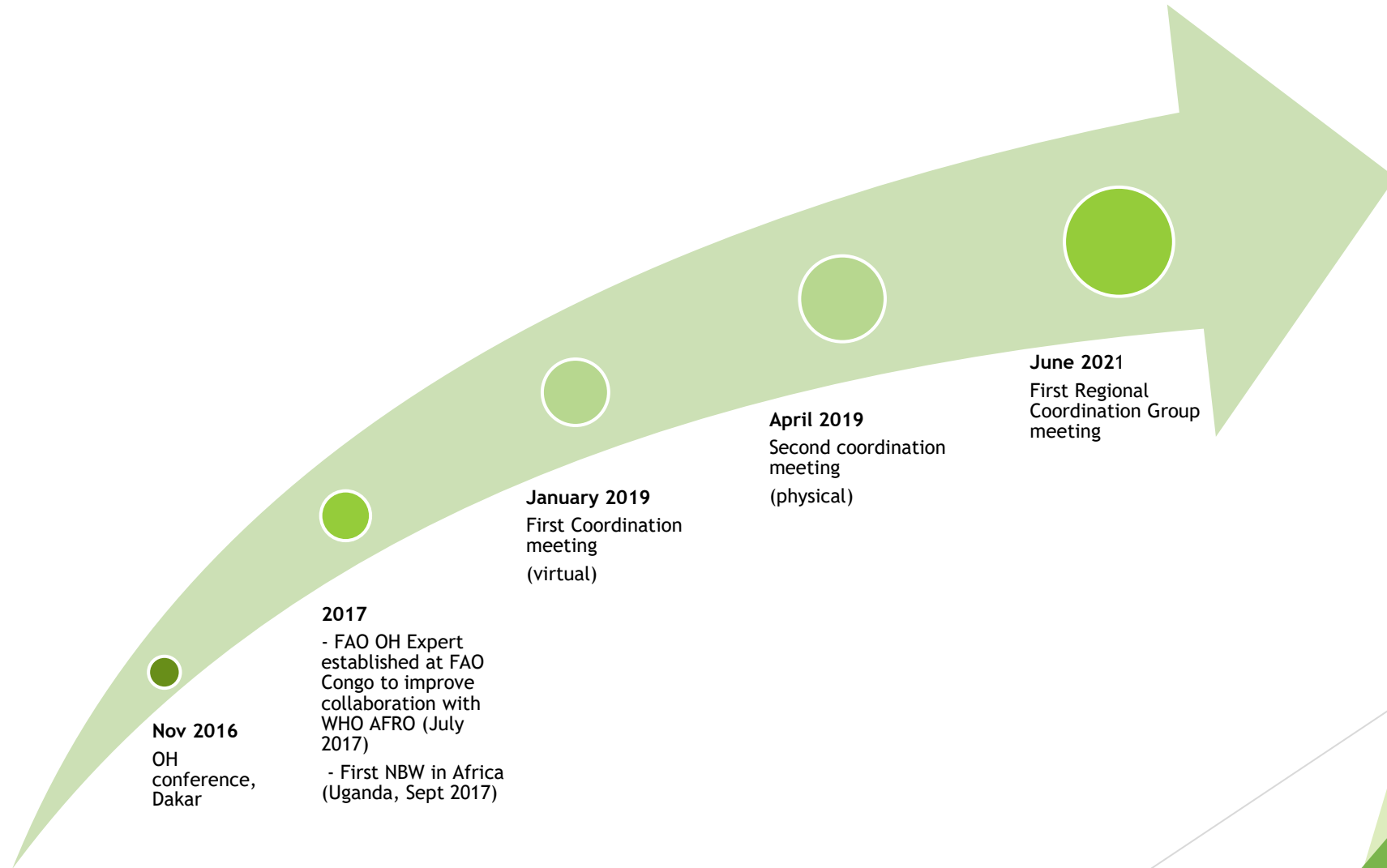

Key resolutions of the first RCG meeting

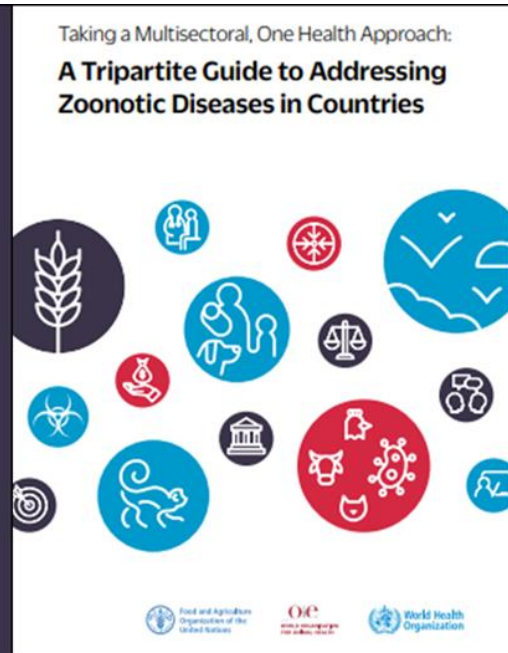
▶ The RCG

- ▶ Welcomed the expansion of the Tripartite to include UNEP
- ▶ Took note of the establishment of the OHHLEP and the preparation of the OHGPA under the leadership of FAO in its capacity of chair of the Tripartite since February 2021
- ▶ Endorsed the proposed format of the 2021 work plan to be further reviewed with UNEP in the course of the year
- ▶ Agreed to continue supporting the preparation and implementation of national rabies elimination plans, and coordinate control activities under the OH approach
- ▶ Finalize the development of the regional joint AMR work plan
- ▶ Support the development of National Action plans, taking advantage of the MPTF

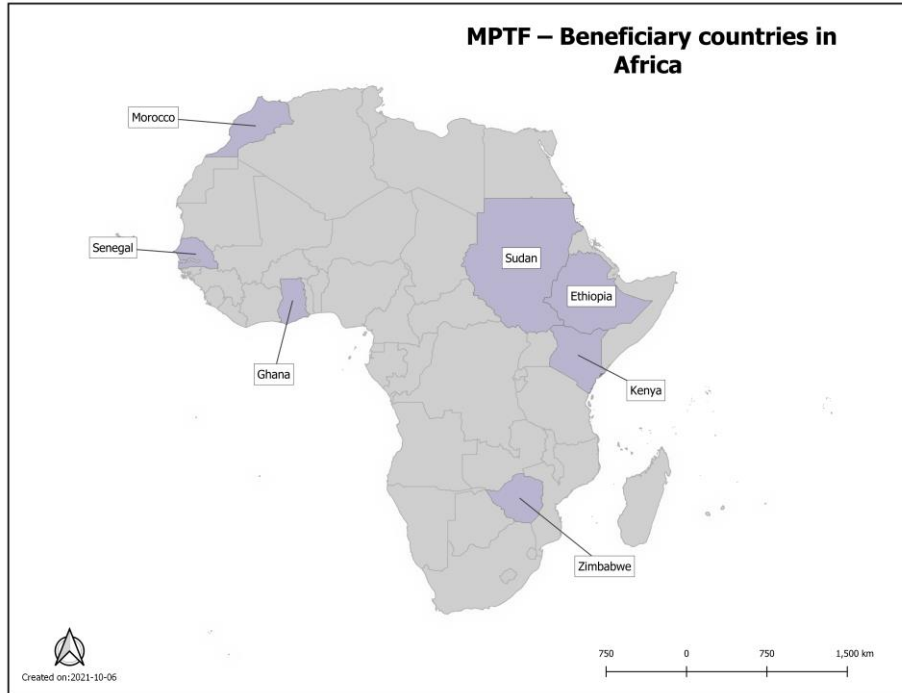

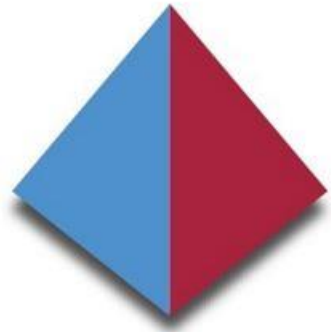
