Basic questions to answer during the process

Strategies implemented to control dog-mediated rabies

> What made Namibia to submit application?

- Namibia is a member of the OIE
- Own wish to apply for OIE recognition of its official rabies control programme in accordance with Chapter 8.14 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code.
- Rabies is currently endemic in Namibia with high incidence in the central and northern areas of the country.
- Namibia has addressed a number of requirements contained in the Terrestrial Animal Health Code.
- In 1997 successfully applied for official OIE recognition of its FMD free zone without vaccination;
- has an official control programme for FMD and CBPP;
- A zone officially free of PPR (2015);
- First in Africa to receive an official recognition of negligible risk status for BSE.

Strategies implemented to control dog-mediated rabies

Actions taken to address the rabies situation in Namibia

- Namibia has developed a rabies control strategy and was officially launched in March 2015.
- In March 2016, a pilot project was launched and implemented towards Dog-mediated Human Rabies elimination,
- Thereafter, a national project roll-out in 2017
- This national project forms the foundation of the official control programme. The official control programme pertains to the whole country of Namibia.
- 2016 German's Federal Government assisted Namibia financially to Fight rabies
- OIE entrusted to provide Technical Assistance to the Project



- DVS management from Animal Disease Control, Epidemiology and Diagnostics and Research Divisions
- Lead team for rabies control strategy implementation (coordination level)
- Technical assistance of the University of Namibia, School of Veterinary Medicine



The Process (Planning, Preparation and information collection) at national level

- > The team led by the CVO (OIE delegate)
- CVO identified relevant people and institution
- Contacted via email and shared terms of references and relevant documents (e,g. policy brief and Namibia rabies operational plan 2020)

> information needed to be included:

- Introduction (background information)
- Governance of the national control programme for dogmediated rabies
- Current status and control of dog-mediated rabies
- Work plan, timelines and budget of the official control programme for dog-mediated rabies for the next five years (Meeting with DVS)


The process...

- Template questionnaire to draft the application
- It has four (4) headings and sub-headings in the questionnaire
- We follow the questionnaire <u>Application for endorsement by the OIE of an official control</u> programme for dog-mediated rabies.
- We accessed the application <u>SOP</u> on the OIE website.
- submission requirements expected are:
 - the questionnaire responses
 - the official control programme for dog-mediated rabies and its annexes
 - o other admin documents such as proof of payment
- The SOP provided adequate information that enabled us as member to follow the procedure.

Submission of an application

The dossier:

- · Compliance with the Terrestrial Code
- Complete the questionnaire Chapters 1.7 to 1.12. + Rabies Questionnaire after May 2020
- 50 pages + appendices (properly cross-referenced) + executive summary
- Digitalised map if relevant (zoning approach)
- Proof of payment
- Contact details of technical staff

- Postponement to the application ۲
- Delay in the preparation process • due to COVID-19 pandemic
- Difficult to smoothly coordinate some of the activities since the beginning of the pandemic
- Organising and conducting all meetings virtually as we had to comply with existing COVID-19 protocol and guidelines



Dear Delegate

The virtual meeting of the OIE Scientific Commission for Animal Diseases (Scientific Commission) was held from 1 to 11 February 2021 and it considered the recommendation made by the ad hoc Group on the Evaluation of official control programme for dog-mediated rables of Members (the Group), in response to your request for sent of the official control programme for dog-mediated rabies of Namibia, in accordance with the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code (Terrestrial Code)

I am pleased to inform you that the Scientific Commission concluded that Namibia fulfils the requirements to have its official control programme for dog-mediated rables endorsed by the OIE, in accordance with Article 8.14.11. of the *Terrestrial Code* and recommended its endorsement by the OIE World Assembly of Delegates at the 88th General Session in May 2021

A letter will be sent to all OIE Delegates giving them <u>60 davs</u> to request any information substantiating this decision should they wish to do so. In accordance with the Standard Operating Procedures for official recognition of disease status and for the endorsement of official control programmes of Members (SOP), in applying for the endorsement of its official control programme for dog-mediated rabies, your country would be committed to ovide the whole or part of the dossier to another Member should it be requested during the 60-day period. d within a maximum of 10 days of receiving such a request

In accordance with the SOP, the detailed assessment carried out by the Group and endorsed by the Scientific Commission will be enclosed as an appendix to the report of the Scientific Commission to be publicly available

While recommending the endorsement of the official control programme for dog-mediated rabies of Namibia the Scientific Commission would draw your attention to the following recommendation of the Group and request you to provide information when submitting the annual reconfirmation of Namibia's OIE endorsed official control programme for dog-mediated rabies in November 2021:

Details about the implementation of a comprehensive dog population management strategy in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 7.7. of the Terrestrial Code.

I hope that the information and advice provided herewith will prove useful to progress favourably towards the control and elimination of dog-mediated rabies in Namibia. Best regards.
